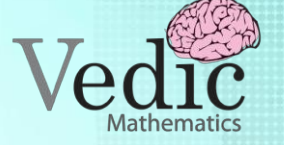

### Death Anniversary – Indian Personalities

**Atal Bihari Vajpayee** : August 16th marks the death anniversary of **Atal Bihari Vajpayee**, the tenth Prime Minister of India. A revered statesman and a founding member of the



Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), he served three terms as prime minister. He was known for

his oratory skills, poetic sensibility, and moderate political views.

#### His significant contributions include:

**Pokhran-II Nuclear Tests (1998)**: He authorized the nuclear tests, which established India as a nuclear power.

**Golden Quadrilateral Project**: He initiated this ambitious highway project to connect India's major cities, boosting infrastructure and economic development.

**Diplomatic Efforts**: He actively pursued peace with Pakistan, most notably through the historic Lahore Bus Yatra.

Vajpayee passed away on August 16, 2018, and his legacy is honored annually with tributes and memorial events across the country.

### Historical Events in India

#### Direct Action Day (1946)

On August 16, 1946, the All-India Muslim League called for a "Direct Action Day" to demand a separate Muslim

nation. What began as a day of protest and a general strike quickly escalated into a period of widespread communal violence and rioting, particularly in Calcutta (now Kolkata). This event, also known as the Great Calcutta Killings, resulted in thousands of deaths and injuries, and is considered a pivotal moment that cemented the path toward the partition of India and Pakistan.

#### Other Events

On August 16, 1947, a day after India gained independence, Jawaharlal Nehru delivered a speech at the Red Fort. This was the first of the annual Independence Day speeches delivered by the Prime Minister of India.

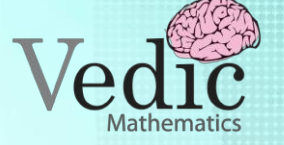

### International Observances

**1977: Voyager 2 Launched:** NASA's Voyager 2 spacecraft was launched, beginning its mission to explore the outer planets of the solar system, including Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune.

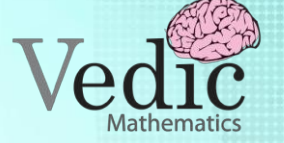
