International Death Anniversaries

1882: Mary Todd Lincoln: Former First Lady of the United States, wife of Abraham Lincoln.

1915: Ellen G. White: American author and co-founder of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

1960: Albert Kesselring: German field marshal during World War II.

1985: Heinrich Böll: German novelist and short story writer, Nobel Prize laureate.

1989: Herbert von Karajan: Austrian conductor, widely regarded as one of the greatest conductors of the 20th century.

Significant international historical events

622 CE: The Hijra (Migration of Prophet Muhammad): This momentous event marks the beginning of the Islamic calendar, as Prophet Muhammad and his followers migrated from Mecca to Medina. It laid the foundation for the spread of Islam and is considered a pivotal turning point in Islamic history.

1054 CE: The Great Schism (East-West Schism): While a culmination of long-standing differences, a significant

event on July 16th saw Roman legates breaking relations with the Eastern Christian churches by excommunicating the Patriarch of Constantinople. This ultimately led to the permanent split between the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church.

1790: Establishment of the District of Columbia: The United States Congress declared the area along the Potomac River, which would become Washington D.C., as the permanent capital of the United States.

1945: Trinity Test (First Atomic Bomb Detonation): As part of the Manhattan Project, the United States successfully detonated the first atomic bomb near Alamogordo, New Mexico. This event ushered in the "Atomic Age" and profoundly changed the course of warfare and international relations.

1969: Apollo 11 Launch: The iconic Apollo 11 mission, carrying astronauts Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins, launched from Cape Kennedy. This mission ultimately led to the first human moon landing, a monumental achievement in space exploration.

1994: Comet Shoemaker-Levy 9 Impacts Jupiter: This marked the first time astronomers observed a direct collision between two celestial bodies in our solar system, providing invaluable data on planetary dynamics.

Other Notable Historical Events

1228: Saint Francis of Assisi Canonized: A significant event for the Catholic Church.

1377: King Richard II of England Crowned: A young king taking the throne, whose reign would face many challenges.

1661: First Banknotes Issued in Europe: Stockholms Banco in Sweden issued the first banknotes, a crucial development in financial history.

1918: Execution of the Romanov Family: Czar Nicholas II of Russia and his family were executed by the Bolsheviks, bringing an end to the Romanov dynasty.

1935: First Parking Meter Installed: Oklahoma City, USA, saw the installation of the world's first parking meter.

1942: Vel' d'Hiv Roundup (Holocaust): The Vichy French government ordered the mass arrest of over 13,000 Jews in Paris, who were then held at the Vélodrome d'Hiver before deportation to Auschwitz.

1951: The Catcher in the Rye Published: J.D. Salinger's influential novel was released, becoming a significant work in 20th-century literature.

1965: Mont Blanc Tunnel Opens: This tunnel, linking France and Italy, was a major feat of engineering.

1979: Saddam Hussein Becomes President of Iraq: A pivotal moment in the modern history of the Middle East.

Indian Sports Related Historical Events

2023: On July 16, 2023, there were several notable results in Indian sports:

- Tanveer won the **Rally of Coimbatore**, a round of the FMSCI MRF MOGRIP Indian National Rally Championship for two-wheelers.

World Sports Related Historical Events

1909: Longest Scoreless Game in AL History: The Detroit Tigers and Washington Senators played 18 scoreless innings, the longest such game in American League history. Tigers pitcher Ed Summers pitched all 18 innings.

1941: Joe DiMaggio Extends Hitting Streak to 56 Games: New York Yankees slugger Joe DiMaggio extended his legendary hitting streak to 56 consecutive games, a Major League Baseball record that still stands today. This is arguably the most significant sports event on this date.

Jagdish Chandra Mathur (1917): Jagdish Chandra Mathur (16 July 1917 –14 May 1978) was a Hindi playwright and writer. He came into fame by his first play Konark. He was born in a village near Khurja. His other famous works includes Phela Raja, Shardiya, Dasrath Nandan, Bhor ka Tara and Oo mere Sapne.

Death Anniversaries – Indian Personalities

D. K. Pattammal (2009): Damal Krishnaswamy Pattammal (19 March 1919 – 16 July 2009), popularly known as D. K. Pattammal or DKP, was an Indian Carnatic musician and a playback singer for film songs in Tamil. Pattammal, along with her contemporaries M. S. Subbulakshmi and M. L. Vasanthakumari, are popularly referred to as the female



trinity of Carnatic Music. This trio initiated the entry of women into mainstream Carnatic Music. She has been appreciated all over the world by Carnatic music lovers.

Important International Observances

Our Lady of Mount Carmel (Christian Feast Day): This is a Catholic feast day commemorating the tradition of the Carmelite Order and the Blessed Virgin Mary. It's particularly significant in some Catholic countries.

Guinea Pig Appreciation Day: Guinea Pig Appreciation Day is celebrated annually on July 16th. It's a day dedicated to celebrating and appreciating these adorable and sociable pets, also known as cavies. The day was founded by Piggles Guinea Pig Rescue in 2016, and the date was chosen because "G" and "P" are the 7th and 16th letters of the alphabet, corresponding to July 16.
