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1. Slovenly

Hindi : मैला-क्चैला

Meaning: (especially of a person or their

appearance) messy and dirty.

Synonyms: scruffy, untidy, messy Antonyms: smart, spruce, stylish

Sentence:

- He was upbraided for his slovenly appearance.
- When you do a job too quickly it's slovenly.
- He has a tendency to be careless and slovenly in his work. Pardhagu
- A fat, **slovenly** ex-rock star.
- She looked **slovenly** and unkempt.

2. Ascendancy

Kannada: ಆರೋಹಣ, ಪ್ರಾಬಲ್ಯ, ಅಧಿಕಾರ

Hindi : प्रभ्तव

Meaning: occupation of a position of

dominant power or influence.

Synonyms: dominance, domination,

supremacy

Antonyms: impotence, impotency,

powerlessness

Sentence:

- He slowly gained ascendancy in the group.
- He sums up with thoughts on the **ascendancy** of the power of nature.
- The poor have a moral ascendancy over the rich.
- Yet his ascendancy was not as smooth and unchallenged as might have been expected.
- Falkirk's **ascendancy** continued but they had goalkeeper Ferguson to thank for their clean sheet.

3. Quintessence

Meaning: the most perfect or typical

example of a quality or class.

Synonyms: perfect example, exemplar,

prototype

Antonyms: exteriority, extra, appearance, front, abstract, top, weakness, enervation, lethargy, meaninglessness

Sentence:

The Parthenon Greece in was considered the quintessence of the perfectly proportioned building.

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- In both his visits to the wicket he was the **quintessence** of anxiety.
- It would have redefined beauty, and captured the very quintessence of rural innocence.
- The Authorized Version became the quintessence of Englishness and an index of human character.
- He was the quintessence of political professionalism.

4. Perpetrated

Meaning: carry out or commit (a harmful, illegal, or immoral action).

Synonyms: commit, carry out, perform Antonyms: skimped, slighted, slurred Sentence:

- A crime has been **perpetrated** against a sovereign state.
- A crime has been **perpetrated** against a sovereign state.
- Much violence was perpetrated in the war.
- We shall the crimes avenge perpetrated against our ancestors.

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5. Pagan

Kannada : ಅಸಂಸ್ಕೃತ, ವಿಗ್ರಹಾರಾಧಕ, ಕ್ಷುದ್ರ ಧರ್ಮಿ, ಜ್ಞಾನೋದಯವಾದವನು, ನಾಸ್ತಿಕ, ವಿಧರ್ಮಿ, ಧರ್ಮಬಾಹಿರ, ನಂಬದವನು, ಅಧಾರ್ಮಿಕ, ಅನಾಗರಿಕ

Hindi: नास्तिक

Meaning: a person holding religious beliefs other than those of the main world religions.

Synonyms: heathen, infidel, idolater

Antonyms: religious, sacred

Sentence:

- The temple was built by pagans in the 4th century as a place to worship their idols.
- A pagan faith group.
- The Slavs were pagan.
- After all, there were Anglo-Saxon pagan gods to sing about as well.
- He is a practising **Pagan**.

6. Acrimonious

Kannada: ಕಟುವಾದ, ನಿಷ್ಠುರ, ತೀವೃತೆ, ಮೊನಚು,

ಹರಿತ, ತೀಕ್ಷತೆ

Hindi: उग्र

Meaning: (typically of speech or a debate)

angry and bitter.

Synonyms: bitter, rancorous, caustic

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Antonyms: caring, gentle, kind Sentence:

- Their marriage ended eight years ago in an acrimonious divorce.
- There has also been a shift away from acrimonious court proceedings.
- After discussions, which at stages were acrimonious, payments were made.
- An acrimonious dispute about wages.

7. Posthaste

Kannada : ಅತ್ಯಂತ ವೇಗವಾಗಿ, ತೀವ್ರವಾಗಿ, ಕಡು

ಚಚ್ಚರದಿಂದ

Hindi : बह्त तेज़ी से

Meaning: with great speed or immediacy. Synonyms: immediately, promptly, readily Antonyms: slowly, ploddingly, sluggishly

Sentence:

- Medical aid must be sent to the stricken area posthaste.
- It should be coming posthaste.
- He was in evening dress, having been summoned posthaste theater.
- He was thinking on ending interview as quickly and conveniently as he might, and hurrying posthaste to those speculative ones.

8. Rancor

Kannada: ಕಡುಹಗೆ, ಬದ್ಧ ದ್ವೇಷ, ಕಹಿ ಭಾವನೆ,

ತೀವ್ರ ಮತ್ನರ

Hindi: विद्वेष

Meaning: bitterness or resentfulness,

especially when long-standing.

Synonyms: bitterness, resentment, malice

Antonyms: amity, goodwill, sympathy

Sentence:

- I have no **rancor** against him.
- She answered her accusers calmly and without rancor.
- In the end, the debate created a degree of rancor among the committee members.

9. Fledgling

Kannada: ಮಂದಗತಿಯ

Hindi: अन्भवहीन मन्ष्य

Meaning: a person who is just starting out

in a field of activity

Synonyms: learner, student, trainee

Antonyms: expert, master, veteran

Sentence:

- In my junior year a friend, a **fledgling** pilot, taught me the basics of handling a small plane.
- Nine years on, that **fledgling** script is about to see the light of day.

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- There will also be funds for training 100,000 teachers, and for fledgling entrepreneurs.
- Many firms that were just fledgling start-ups in 2000 are now mature, profitable businesses.
- Extremely poor, it was nonetheless peaceful, stable and a fledgling democracy.
