National Integration Day (Quami Ekta Divas): This day



observed annually to commemorate the birth anniversary of Indira Gandhi, the first and only woman Prime Minister of India. The day aims to promote and consolidate the

spirit of unity, peace, love, and brotherhood among all Indians, celebrating India's cultural, linguistic, and religious diversity.

## **Birth Anniversaries – Indian Personalities**

Keshav Chandra Sen (1838-1884): 19 November 1838



- 8 January 1884) was an Indian philosopher and social reformer who attempted incorporate Christian theology within the framework of Hindu thought. Born a Hindu the Bengal Presidency of British

India, he became a member of the Brahmo Samaj in 1857 established his own breakaway "Bharatvarshiya Brahmo Samaj" in 1866 while the Brahmo Samaj remained under the leadership of Debendranath Tagore (who headed the Brahmo Samaj until his death in 1905).In 1878, his followers abandoned him after the underage child marriage of his daughter which exposed his campaign against child marriage as hollow.

Indira Gandhi (1917–1984): 19 November 1917 – 31 October 1984) was an Indian politician and stateswoman who served as the prime minister of India from 1966 to 1977 and again from 1980 until her assassination in 1984. She was India's first and only female prime minister as of 2025, and a central figure

in Indian politics as the leader of the Indian National



Congress (INC). She was the daughter of Jawaharlal Nehru, the first prime minister of India, and the mother of Rajiv Gandhi, who succeeded her as prime minister. Her cumulative tenure of 15 years and 350 days makes he the second-longest-serving

prime minister after her father.

Dara Singh (1928–2012): 19 November 1928 – 12 July 2012) was an Indian professional wrestler, actor, and



politician. Widely regarded as one of India's greatest wrestlers, Singh earned international recognition during the 1950s and 1960s for his victories in both Indian and world wrestling circuits. In 1968, Singh became world champion by defeating

Lou Thesz. Transitioning to cinema, Singh appeared in over 100 Hindi and Punjabi films, often portraying strong and heroic characters, and is best remembered for his iconic role as Hanuman in the television series Ramayan (1987–1988). He was the first sportsperson to be nominated as Member of the Rajya Sabha from 2003 to 2009, he was also awarded the Padma Shri in 1996. Singh was inducted into the Legacy wing of the WWE Hall of Fame Class of 2018.

## **Historical event for India**

#### 1. Law and Governance

1986: Environment Protection Act came into force.


The Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 (EPA), one of the most comprehensive environmental laws in India, was enacted and came into force on this date. It was largely a legislative response following the 1984 Bhopal Gas Tragedy, empowering the Central Government to take measures for the purpose of protecting and improving the quality of the environment.

1997: Kalpana Chawla's first space mission began.

Kalpana Chawla became the first Indian-origin woman to go into space when her Space Shuttle Columbia flight STS-87 launched on November 19, 1997. She served as a mission specialist and primary robotic arm operator.

1994: Aishwarya Rai won the Miss World title.

Indian film actress and model Aishwarya Rai was crowned Miss World on November 19, 1994, bringing international recognition to India.

#### 4. Sports

1982: The 9th Asian Games began in Delhi.

The Ninth Asian Games officially commenced in New Delhi on November 19, 1982. This was a major international multi-sport event that showcased India's capability to host large-scale global sporting events.

#### 2023: Cricket World Cup Final in Ahmedabad.

The 2023 ICC Men's Cricket World Cup Final was held on this date at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad, where India faced Australia.


Christina Onassis (1950–1988): Greek businesswoman and socialite, heiress to the Onassis shipping fortune.

## **International Historical Events**

#### **Diplomacy and Geopolitics**

## 1903: The Hay-Bunau-Varilla Treaty Signed (Panama Canal):

This treaty was signed between the United States and Panama, giving the U.S. exclusive and perpetual rights to a 10-mile-wide strip of land for the construction and control of the Panama Canal Zone. It was pivotal for global trade and American military strategy in the 20th century.

## 1971: Oman Declared Independence:

The Sultanate of Oman formally declared independence from the United Kingdom, marking the end of its status as a British protectorate.

## 1993: North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) Approved:

The U.S. House of Representatives approved the NAFTA agreement, which created a major trilateral trade bloc between Canada, Mexico, and the United States.

#### 1993: South Africa Approves New Constitution:

A significant step in ending apartheid, 21 political parties in South Africa approved a new, multi-racial constitution, expanding voting rights and officially ending white minority rule.

#### 2. World War and Post-War Milestones

#### 1916: World War I - End of the Battle of the Somme:

British Expeditionary Force commander Douglas Haig called off the First Battle of the Somme in France. Starting on July 1, 1916, it was one of the deadliest battles in human history, resulting in over a million casualties.

#### 1918: Latvia Declared Independence:

Following the end of World War I, the Republic of Latvia proclaimed its independence from Russia.

#### 1961: Vietnam War Escalation:

U.S. President John F. Kennedy officially announced the decision to send 18,000 military advisors to South Vietnam, a significant escalation of American involvement in the conflict.

#### 3. Culture and Technology

#### 1928: Mickey Mouse Debuts in Steamboat Willie:

Walt Disney's animated short film Steamboat Willie premiered in New York City. It was the first fully synchronized sound cartoon and introduced the world to the iconic characters Mickey Mouse and Minnie Mouse.

#### **1883:** Standard Time Adopted in North America:

The U.S. and Canadian railroads officially adopted Standard Time Zones, ending the confusion of thousands of local times and marking a major step towards standardized global time.

#### 1963: Push-Button Telephone Goes into Service:

The first commercial push-button (Touch-Tone) telephone service was introduced in the United States, beginning the slow replacement of the traditional rotary-dial phone.

## **Sports-related Historical Events** Internationally

#### 1. Boxing

#### 1970: Joe Frazier Knocks Out Bob Foster:

Heavyweight Champion Joe Frazier successfully defended his world heavyweight title by defeating light heavyweight champion Bob Foster with a knockout in the second round of their fight in Detroit.

#### 2. Tennis

#### 1990: Monica Seles Wins Five-Set Epic:

Monica Seles defeated Gabriela Sabatini in the final of the Virginia Slims Championships (now the WTA Finals) in a grueling five-set match: 6-4, 5-7, 3-6, 6-4, 6-2. This was the first five-set women's match since 1901 and demonstrated a monumental shift in the physicality and endurance of women's tennis.

## 2007: Roger Federer Wins Masters Cup:

Top-ranked Roger Federer won his fourth Masters Cup title (now the ATP Finals), overwhelming David Ferrer in straight sets. The win also pushed Federer's season winnings over \$10 million, an ATP Tour record at the time.

#### 3. Auto Racing

## **2007:** Jimmie Johnson's Consecutive Championships:

Jimmie Johnson became the first driver since Jeff Gordon (1997-1998) to win consecutive NASCAR Nextel Cup championships (now Cup Series), securing the title in the season finale.

## 2018: Joey Logano Wins NASCAR Cup:

Joey Logano captured his first NASCAR Cup championship, winning the season finale race to beat out the favored "Big Three" of drivers.

## 1978: Frank Mordica's NCAA Rushing Record:

Vanderbilt running back Frank Mordica rushed for an incredible 321 yards and five touchdowns in a single game against Air Force, setting a new single-game record for college football at the time.

#### 2012: Matt Schaub's Near-Record Passing Day:

Houston Texans quarterback Matt Schaub completed a franchise-record 43 passes for 527 yards (the secondmost in NFL history at the time) in a 43-37 overtime win, demonstrating one of the greatest aerial performances in league history.
