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### 1. Pantomimed

**Kannada :** ಮಕ್ಕಳ ನಾಟಕ, ಮೂಕ ವೇಷಧಾರಿ

**Hindi :** अभिव्यक्त करना

**Meaning:** express or represent (something) by extravagant and exaggerated mime.

**Synonyms:** gestured, signed, signalized

**Antonyms :** Verbalized, Spoke, Articulated, Narrated

**Sentence:**

- The clown candidates **pantomimed** different emotions.
- The drive to town was a **pantomime**.
- He made a **pantomime** of checking his watch.
- Rocky needed a bath and that is a real **pantomime** as he HATES being washed.
- He was an actor famous for playing the dame in **pantomime**.

### 2. Parlous

**Kannada :** ಕಷ್ಟಕರವಾದ

**Hindi :** जोखिमी

**Meaning:** full of danger or uncertainty; precarious.

**Synonyms:** dangerous, grievous, hazardous

**Antonyms:** harmless, innocent, innocuous

**Sentence:**

- Window washing can indeed be a **parlous** occupation on a skyscraper.
- She is **parlous** handsome.

- The railways emerged in a **parlous** state, in dire need of a major overhaul.
- The **parlous** state of the economy.
- The General's position was **parlous**.

### 3. Disparaged

**Kannada :** ಅವಹೇಳನ ಮಾಡಲಾಗಿದೆ

**Hindi :** अपमानित करना

**Meaning:** regard or represent as being of little worth.

**Synonyms:** denigrate, deprecate, depreciate

**Antonyms:** acclaimed, applauded, exalted

**Sentence:**

- Her bad behavior has **disparaged** her whole family.
- He has **disparaged** and degraded women.
- Those who can not be convinced deserve to be **disparaged**.
- It is true to say they have **disparaged** both men.
- Some other documentary photographers were quite **disparaging** about my work.

### 4. Derelict

**Kannada :** ನಿರ್ಲಕ್ಷ್ಯ

**Hindi :** त्याग किया हुआ







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**Meaning:** in a very poor condition as a result of disuse and neglect.

**Synonyms:** dilapidated, ramshackle, neglecting

**Antonyms:** conscientious, nonnegligent

**Sentence:**

- He purchased an old **derelict** mansion that was rumored to be haunted.
- The barge lay **derelict** for years.
- We bought a **derelict** farmhouse and did it up.
- He was **derelict** in his duty to his country.
- The barge lay **derelict**.

### 5. Attrition

**Kannada :** ತಿಕ್ಕಾಟ, ಉಜ್ಜಾಟ

**Hindi :** धीरे-धीरे कमजोर होना

**Meaning:** a gradual weakening, loss, or destruction

**Synonyms:** weakening, debilitation, enfeebling

**Antonyms:** buildup, gain

**Sentence:**

- The council is trying to wear down the opposition by **attrition**.
- The skull shows **attrition** of the edges of the teeth.
- No other army in the world would choose to sustain such an **attrition** rate.

- Their divorce had become a war of **attrition**.
- Some of those job losses will come through natural **attrition**.

### 6. Glossary

**Kannada :** ಪಾರಿಭಾಷಿಕ ಕೋಶ

**Hindi :** शब्दकोष

**Meaning:** an alphabetical list of terms or words found in or relating to a specific subject, text, or dialect, with explanations; a brief dictionary.

**Synonyms:** dictionaries, wordbooks, catalogues

**Antonyms :** Unindexed, Unannotated, Undefined terms, Listless terms

**Sentence:**

- The book includes a **glossary** of financial terms.
- You'll find a **glossary** of computing terms at the back.
- So a few words in the **glossary** were inadequately defined?
- A **glossary** of Inuktitut words.
- The book includes a comprehensive **glossary**.

### 7. Prodigious

**Kannada :** ಅದ್ಭುತ, ಅಸಾಧಾರಣ, ಅಗಾಧ

**Hindi :** अद्भुत







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**Meaning:** remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree.

**Synonyms:** enormous, colossal, immense

**Antonyms:** unimpressive, common, ordinary

**Sentence:**

- What a **prodigious** opportunity you have missed.
- He took a **prodigious** amount of drugs washed down with booze.
- The stove consumed a **prodigious** amount of fuel.
- The cost of these proposals is **prodigious**.
- His own **prodigious** creative talent was fuelled by the stuff of the everyday.

### 8. Edify

**Kannada :** ಸಂವಾದಿಸು, ಉತ್ತಮಗೊಳಿಸು

**Hindi :** उपदेश देना

**Meaning:** instruct or improve (someone) morally or intellectually.

**Synonyms:** educate, instruct, teach

**Antonyms:** confuse, perplex, puzzle

**Sentence:**

- They tried to **edify** the child with music.
- These books will both entertain and **edify** readers.
- The much-in-vogue hybrid mode proves more cryptic than **edifying** this time around.

- When Taylor and Dion dig into the past, the results are **edifying**.

### 9. Daze

**Kannada :** ದಿಗ್ಭ್ರಮೆ, ಬೆರಗು, ಮಂಕು, ದಿಗ್ಭ್ರಾಂತಿ, ತಬ್ಬಿಬ್ಬಾಗು

**Hindi :** मति-मंद करना

**Meaning:** make (someone) unable to think or react properly; stupefy; bewilder.

**Synonyms:** stun, stupefy, dumbfound

**Antonyms :** Focus, Clarity, Alertness, Awareness, Concentration

**Sentence:**

- The fall **daze** him for a moment, causing him to become disoriented.
- What time is it?' I mumbled in a sleepy **daze**.
- They were slouched on the sofa in a **daze**.
- I went about the rest of my day in a **daze**.
- He was walking around in a **daze**.

### 10. Balk

**Kannada :** ಹಿಂಜರಿಕೆ, ಬೇಡ ಎನ್ನಲು, ವಿರೋಧಿಸು, ಹಠ ಮಾಡು

**Hindi :** बाधा डालना

**Meaning:** to prevent from achieving a goal

**Synonyms:** block, hinder, thwart

**Antonyms:** facilitate, assist, encourage





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**Sentence:**

- Their strategies to **balk** the enemy had failed.
- It's got to be done, so why **balk** it?
- A balk of timber.
- He raised every objection he could to **balk** this plan.
