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### 1. Extricate

**Kannada :** ಹೊರತೆಗೆಯಿರಿ, ಬಿಡಿಸು, ಪಾರುಮಾಡು

**Hindi :** छुड़ाना

**Meaning:** to set free from entanglement or difficulty

**Synonyms:** liberate, free, disentangle

**Antonyms:** hinder, impede, embroil

**Sentence:**

- How was he going to **extricate** himself from this situation?
- Our aim is to **extricate** the country from this costly war.
- They managed to **extricate** the pilot from the wreckage.
- He was trying to **extricate** himself from official duties.
- The wanted to **extricate** him from his difficulties.

### 2. Palaver

**Kannada :** ಮುಖಸ್ತುತಿ, ಪುಸಲಾಯಿಸು, ಗೊಡ್ಡು ಹರಟೆ, ಕಸಿದುಕೊ, ಗಿಲೀಟು ಮಾಡಿ ಬೇಕಾದ್ದನ್ನು ಪಡೆ

**Hindi :** वार्ता

**Meaning:** to engage in casual or rambling conversation

**Synonyms:** chat, talk, converse

**Antonyms:** quiet,

**Sentence:**

- Mothers **palavering** and drinking coffee while watching their children play.
- He had many very impressive **palavers** with the chiefs.
- He knew how to make decisions, without nonsense and without **palaver**.
- The numbers in those three categories will not decrease; if anything, they will increase, notwithstanding the **palaver** about family values.
- Then, none of that **palaver** would have taken place.

### 3. Proofreading

**Sentence:**

- He **proofread** the essay carefully.
- Before submitting her application, she carefully **proofread** the document to ensure there were no typos.





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- The final stage of the editing process involves **proofreading** the entire manuscript.
- As a professional writer, she always takes time to **proofread** her work before publishing.
- The editor assigned a team member to **proofread** the newsletter before sending it to subscribers.

#### 4. Omniscient

**Meaning:** knowing everything; having unlimited understanding or knowledge

**Synonyms:** almighty, all-knowing

**Antonyms:** natural

**Sentence:**

- The novel has an **omniscient** narrator.
- A third-person **omniscient** narrator.
- An **omniscient** author knows everything about everybody in the story.

#### 5. Hallowed

**Kannada :** ಪವಿತ್ರಗೊಳಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ, ಪ್ರತಿಷ್ಠಿತ, ಗೌರವಾನ್ವಿತ, ಸಂತನಾದ, ಮಹಾತ್ಮನಾದ

**Hindi :** पवित्र

**Meaning:** set apart or worthy of veneration by association with God

**Synonyms:** sacred, holy, venerated

**Antonyms:** unhallowed, nonreligious

**Sentence:**

- Hallowed** traditions that bind the present generation with all those that have gone before.
- The Ganges is **hallowed** as a sacred, cleansing river.
- The priest **hallowed** the wine.
- The band will be in some **hallowed** and historic surroundings.
- The **hallowed** turf of Wimbledon.

#### 6. Assessing

**Kannada :** ಮೌಲ್ಯಮಾಪನ, ಕಂದಾಯ ಹಾಕು, ನಿಗದಿಮಾಡು, ಬೆಲೆಕಟ್ಟು, ತೆರಿಗೆಹಾಕು

**Hindi :** आकलन

**Meaning:** evaluate or estimate the nature, ability, or quality of.

**Synonyms:** estimating, evaluating, judge

**Antonyms :** dismiss, disregard, ignore, discard, avoid,, overlook, scorn, avert, bypass, shirk

**Sentence:**

- What criteria are used for **assessing** a student's ability?
- Today systems staff are **assessing** the damage caused by the electronic love letter virus.





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- Establishing the reliability and validity of measures is important for **assessing** their quality.

### 7. Defenestration

**Kannada :** ರಕ್ಷಣೆ, ನಿರ್ಜಲೀಕರಣ, ಕಿಟಕಿಯಿಂದ ಹೊರಗೆ ತೂರಿಹಾಕುವುದು

**Hindi :** खिड़की से बाहर निकालना

**Synonyms :** Ejection, Expulsion, Ousting, Displacement, Projection, Eviction, Catapulting, Launch, Deposition

**Antonyms :** In fenestration, Insertion, Admission, Retention, Reinsertion

**Sentence:**

- Death by **defenestration** has a venerable history.
- He opened a window for the **defenestration**.
- He has governed so badly as to deserve automatic **defenestration**.
- If he loses the election, expect a few **defenestration's** in the Republican Party.
- The **defenestration** of the Catholic commissioners in Prague precipitated the Thirty Years' War.
- When the new corporate board was voted in, there was a massive

**defenestration** of high-level executives.

- Ingrid's annoyance at the alarm clock's persistent drone led to the clock's sudden **defenestration** from her eighth-floor bedroom.

### 8. Betwixt

**Hindi :** बीच में

**Meaning:** between (two people or things).

**Synonyms:** between, among, amidst

**Antonyms:** from, out of

**Sentence:**

- He took a seat **betwixt** two other passengers.
- He took it **betwixt** thumb and a forefinger with a connoisseur's care.
- The state takes notice of the private difference **betwixt** you and the cardinal.

### 9. Cursory

**Kannada :** ಅವಸರದ, ಸ್ಥೂಲ, ಆತುರದ, ಗಡಿಬಡಿಯ, ಸೂಕ್ಷ್ಮವಲ್ಲದ

**Hindi :** तीव्र

**Meaning:** acting or done with excessive or careless speed

**Synonyms:** hurried, rushed, hasty







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**Antonyms:** deliberate, unhurried, unrushed

**Sentence:**

- He signed with only a **cursor**y glance at the report.
- I didn't give the letter more than a **cursor**y glance.
- A **cursor**y glance at the papers told me all I wanted to know.
- A **cursor**y glance at the figures.
- When buying a property, you must give it more than a **cursor**y inspection.

### 10. Frowned

**Kannada :** ಗಂಟಿಕ್ಕಿದ, ಕೋಪಭಾವವನ್ನು ತೋರಿಸಿದರು, ಭೃಕುಟಿಸಿದರು

**Hindi :** क्रोध से देखना

**Meaning:** to look with anger or disapproval

**Synonyms:** glared, stared, scowled

**Antonyms:** smiled, grinned

**Sentence:**

- The boss just stood there and **frowned** at his assistant who, once again, was in trouble.
- She **frowned** as she read the letter from her landlord.
- He **frowned** as he reread the letter.
- Michael **frowned** faintly in confusion, not understanding the sudden change in her mood.
- He **frowned** disapprovingly at me.
