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### 1. Wrest

**Kannada :** ಹಿಡಿತ, ತಿರುಚು, ವಿರೂಪಗೊಳಿಸು, ಕಿತ್ತುಕೊಳ್ಳು, ಬಲೈಯಿಂದ ತೆಗೆದುಕೊಳ್ಳು, ಕಸಿದುಕೊಳ್ಳು ಕಿತ್ತುಕೊಳ್ಳು

**Hindi :** खींचना

**Meaning:** to draw out by force or with effort

**Synonyms:** wrench, pull, extract

**Antonyms:** insert, instill

**Sentence:**

- I managed to **wrest** the photograph from his grasp.
- I tried to **wrest** the gun from him.
- Leila tried to **wrest** her arm from his hold.
- He will be seeking to **wrest** the title from the current champion.
- They attempted to **wrest** control of the company's board from him.

### 2. Stealthiest

**Kannada :** ಅತ್ಯಂತ ರಹಸ್ಯವಾದ, ಗುಟ್ಟಿನ, ಮುಚ್ಚುಮರೆಯ, ಕಳ್ಳ ತನದ

**Hindi :** गुप्त

**Meaning:** behaving, done, or made cautiously and secretly, so as not to be seen or heard.

**Synonyms:** furtive, secretive, clandestine

**Antonyms:** open, public

**Sentence:**

- Cats are among the **stealthiest** of stalkers.
- The **stealthiest** way of launching the mini-sub will be underwater, via another submarine.

### 3. Gullible

**Kannada :** ವೋಸಕ್ಕೆ ಒಳಗಾಗು, ಮೋಸಹೋಗಬಲ್ಲ

**Hindi :** भोला

**Meaning:** easily persuaded to believe something; credulous

**Synonyms:** credulous, over-trusting, easily deceived

**Antonyms:** cynical, mistrustful, sophisticated

**Sentence:**

- He's so **gullible** he'll believe anything.
- They must be pretty **gullible** to fall for an old trick like that.
- How **gullible** we were to swallow his promise of a proper debate.
- They convinced a **gullible** public that their policies were the right ones.
- He is utterly charmless and few people are **gullible** enough to believe him.





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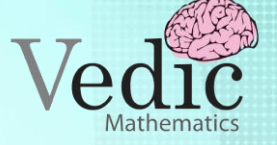
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#### 4. Solace

**Kannada :** ಸಮಾಧಾನ, ಸಾಂತ್ವನ, ಉಪಶಮನ

**Hindi :** आश्वासन

**Meaning:** give comfort or consolation to.

**Synonyms:** comfort, console, cheer

**Antonyms:** anguish, distress

**Sentence:**

- She smiled, as though **solaced** by the memory.
- She sought **solace** in her religion.
- She found **solace** for her grief by teaching herself to sew using an embroidery kit..
- She finds **solace** in gardening"
- The doors of the sanctuary will open for one month to families seeking **solace**.

#### 5. Evermore

**Kannada :** ಎಂದೆಂದಿಗೂ

**Hindi :** हमेशा के लिये

**Meaning:** (chiefly used for rhetorical effect or in ecclesiastical contexts) always.

**Synonyms:** always, forever, eternally

**Antonyms:** never, nevermore, ne'er

**Sentence:**

- The editor's decision is final and shall **evermore** remain so.
- We pray that we may **evermore** dwell in him and he in us.

- It's not difficult to see why magazines are turning to **evermore** aggressive retail tactics.

#### 6. Headlong

**Kannada :** ತಲೆತಲಾಂತರದಿಂದ, ತಲೆ ಮುಂದಾದ, ಬಲುಜೋರಿನ, ದುಡುಕಿನ, ಆತುರದ, ಅವಿವೇಕದ, ಅಚಾತುರ್ಯದ, ಮುಂದಾಲೋಚನೆಯಿಲ್ಲದ, ವಿವೇಚನೆ ಇಲ್ಲದ, ಬಲುಜೋರಿನ

**Hindi :** हड़बड़ी

**Meaning:** in a rush; with reckless haste.

**Synonyms:** hurried, rushed, sudden

**Antonyms:** deliberate, unhurried, calculated

**Sentence:**

- Those who rush **headlong** to join in the latest craze.
- A **headlong** dash through the house.
- Those who rush **headlong** to join in the latest craze.
- He crashed **headlong** into a tree.
- He fell **headlong** into the tent.

#### 7. Obduracy

**Kannada :** ಅಸ್ಪಷ್ಟತೆ, ಹಠಮಾರಿತನ, ಮೊಂಡುತನ

**Hindi :** हठ

**Meaning:** a steadfast adherence to an opinion, purpose, or course of action in spite of reason, arguments, or persuasion





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**Synonyms:** obdurateness, obstinacy, stubbornness

**Antonyms:** broad-mindedness, open-mindedness, reasonability

**Sentence:**

- His error was sheer **obduracy** in refusing to admit a mistake.
- The **obduracy** of the police in failing to take the complaint seriously is deeply troubling.
- Analysts have been surprised by the **obduracy** of the price of oil.
- Unless they will work to overcome their **obduracy**, it's hard to see how they will ever be friends.

### 8. Encrust

**Kannada :** ಆವರಿಸು

**Hindi :** जमना

**Meaning:** cover (something) with a hard surface layer.

**Synonyms:** coagulate, congeal, cover

**Antonyms :** clean, cleanse, clear, flourish, grow, improve, purify, sterilize

**Sentence:**

- She arrived home with her knees **encrusted** with mud.
- The manuscript is bound in gold and silver and **encrusted** with jewels.

### 9. Avouchment

**Kannada :** ದೃಢೀಕರಣ, ಹೊಂದಾಣಿಕೆ

**Hindi :** घोषणा

**Meaning:** a solemn and often public declaration of the truth or existence of something

**Synonyms:** declaration, assertion, claim

**Antonyms:** dispute, question

**Sentence:**

- Your **avouchment** of his good intentions means he won't be disciplined.
- If the image ' of a so great virtue doth not affect thee, Yet this bough'—glittering she revealed its golden **avouchment**.

### 10. Pang

**Kannada :** ಯಾತನೆ, ಚಳಕು, ಚುಚ್ಚುನೋವು, ತೀವ್ರಯಾತನೆ

**Hindi :** पीड़ा

**Meaning:** a sudden sharp pain or painful emotion.

**Synonyms:** pain, sting, discomfort

**Antonyms:** aid, assist, comfort

**Sentence:**

- He experienced a sudden **pang** of conscience.
- **Pang** full of meat and bread.







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- He was a rude man and **pang** full of oaths.
- Lindsey experienced a sharp **pang** of guilt.
- I felt a **pang** of nostalgia for my childhood home.
