### Biodiversity & Conservation:

#### **Domestic Conservation Efforts**

Gujarat celebrating remarkable conservation success with the return of the Asiatic lion to the Barda Wildlife Sanctuary after 143 years. The state's lion population has grown to 891 in 2025, a 32% increase since 2020. This success is attributed to "Project Lion," a government initiative that focuses on habitat management, health monitoring, and mitigating human-wildlife conflict. To further boost conservation and eco-tourism, the state has launched various projects worth ₹180 crore, including a new safari park in Barda.

In Haryana, Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini announced an ambitious target of planting over 2.1 crore saplings to combat climate change, irregular rainfall, and rising temperatures. The state-level "Van Mahotsav" event marked the launch of several new projects, including the Saraswati Wetland Reservoir and a biodiversity park.

In a concerning development, the endangered golden langur in Assam is facing threats from electrocution and habitat loss. Two incidents were reported in early August where langurs were harmed by exposed electrical wires, highlighting a need for improved infrastructure and conservation measures.

### Global Conservation & Policy

The Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) is a central theme in international discussions. The Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) highlighted the framework's importance in statements for the

International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples, recognizing that their traditional knowledge is crucial for its implementation. The CBD also emphasized the G7's leadership in achieving the GBF and its goal of reducing plastic pollution.

Progress is being made on the High Seas Treaty, also known as the BBNJ Agreement. The recent UN Ocean Conference saw 19 additional countries deposit their ratifications, bringing the total to 50 and moving it closer to the 60 ratifications needed for it to enter into force. This treaty is a landmark effort to protect marine biological diversity in areas beyond national jurisdiction.

The IUCN Red List has released a new update, revealing that more than 1,000 fungi species are now on the list, highlighting growing threats from deforestation and agriculture. The report also notes a decrease in the poaching of African rhinos since 2021, but warns that other threats like drought are offsetting these gains.

In Australia, reforms to the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) are underway. These reforms aim to establish a national environment protection agency to strengthen environmental protection and streamline project assessments.


