Biodiversity & Conservation:

On September 12, 2025, several notable events and reports are shaping the fields of biodiversity and conservation. Key developments include new funding initiatives, research on marine ecosystems, and ongoing efforts to address global challenges.

Global Biodiversity Framework Fund (GBFF) **Funding:** The Global Environment Facility (GEF) has opened the first selection round of the second tranche of the GBFF, a crucial fund designed to support the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global **Biodiversity** Framework. This round prioritizes projects from Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs), recognizing their vulnerability and the critical role they play in global biodiversity.

Innovations in Addressing Invasive Species: A symposium is taking place on this day focusing on "Innovating Against Invasive Species" in the Pacific region. The event highlights how sciencedriven solutions are being turned into action to combat the spread of invasive species, which are a major threat to native ecosystems. This is a timely effort given a recent report from September 5, 2025, which revealed that all sea turtle species in the Pacific are threatened with extinction.

Community-Led Conservation in India: India's Forest and Environment Minister, Wangki Lowang, emphasized that community-led conservation efforts are kev to future sustainability. Speaking at an event in Arunachal Pradesh, a region with nearly 79% of its area under forest cover, he praised the active role of local communities in protecting wildlife

and highlighted the "Pakke Declaration" on climate change as a milestone for the state.

UNESCO Global Geoparks Expansion: The UNESCO Global Geoparks Council has proposed 12 new geoparks for endorsement, which would expand the global network to 241 sites. These sites are managed to integrate protection, education, and sustainable development, with a focus on linking geodiversity, biodiversity, and human communities. This expansion reflects a growing recognition of the interconnectedness of geological and biological heritage.


Marine Biodiversity Discoveries: The Ocean Census, a global collaboration to accelerate the discovery of marine life, has identified 866 new marine species. These discoveries, made from depths ranging from 1 to 4,990 meters, include new species of sharks, sea stars, and a uniqu guitar shark. The new data will be used to inform conservation strategies and manage marine resources.

Deep-Sea Snailfish Discovery: Researchers have discovered and described three new species of deep-sea snailfish in the Pacific Ocean, including the "bumpy snailfish" (Careproctus collicu**)**i This discovery underscores the importance of deep-ocean biodiversity studies as human activity and climate change increasingly impact marine ecosystems.


