Biodiversity & Conservation on September 20, 2025

Historic Marine Treaty Ratified Morocco became the 60th nation to sign on to the world's first treaty to protect international waters, paving the way for the High Seas Treaty to take effect next year. This landmark agreement is a legal framework to protect marine diversity in international waters, which lie beyond the jurisdiction of any single country and account for nearly two-thirds of the ocean. This is a major step toward protecting these vulnerable areas from threats like over-fishing, climate change, and deep-sea mining.

Jodhpur Consultation on Open Ecosystems state-level consultation was held in Jodhpur, India, to create a roadmap for conserving Rajasthan's Open Natural Ecosystems (ONEs), such as deserts and grasslands. The meeting, which brought together senior officials from the Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) and other organizations, highlighted the ecological and economic value of these ecosystems. Experts stressed the need for cross-sectoral coordination and the inclusion of ONEs in official land-use records to mitigate the adverse impacts of climate change.

3. Urban Conservation Challenges in Bengaluru A recent report on Bengaluru's biodiversity has brought to light the city's struggle to protect its green spaces amidst rapid urbanization. The report notes that while some institutional areas have green cover, they lack biodiversity, and the city's tree cover is only 14.78%. The study also revealed that while some bird species are adapting to urbanized zones, others are

declining and can only be found in the city's larger, cooler green spaces. The report suggests prioritizing the planting of native, broad-canopy tree species to support biodiversity and mitigate the urban heat island effect.
