

I. Geopolitical & International Relations in Defence

Europe's Defence Buildup and US Pivot to Indo-Pacific: The EU's defense commissioner stated that Europe needs to significantly boost its military capabilities as the United States shifts its focus towards countering China's rising military power in the Indo-Pacific. This comes after NATO allies agreed to increase their defence spending. (BSS, July 22, 2025)

UK's Military Support Campaign for Ukraine: The British Defence Secretary John Healey announced a 50-day military support campaign for Ukraine. This initiative, aligning with a warning from US President Donald Trump to Russia, aims to supply critical air defence ammunition to Ukraine to "force Putin to the negotiating table." Britain and Germany have also agreed to jointly provide air defence missiles. (Ommcom News, July 22, 2025)

Russia-Iran Joint Naval Exercise (CASAREX **2025):** Russia and Iran launched the CASAREX 2025 joint naval exercise in the Caspian Sea on July 21, 2025. This operation is seen as a strong assertion of their military presence, enhancing maritime security and rescue operations, and consolidating their control in the strategically important Caspian Sea region. It could also be a warning to Azerbaijan against interference. (SpecialEurasia, July 21, 2025)

China-Taiwan **Tensions** and Han Kuang **Exercises:** Taiwan is continuing its annual Han Kuang military exercises, focusing on the defense of offshore islands, utilizing new USmade systems. and preparing civilian infrastructure for conflict. Meanwhile, the China Coast Guard (CCG) continues "dark" patrols (with AIS turned off) in the restricted waters around Taiwan's Pratas Island and Kinmen Islands, escalating harassment tactics. NATO Summit of 2025 Outcomes: The recent NATO Summit in The Hague (June 25, 2025) saw a recommitment to collective defense and a new target for allies to invest 5% of GDP annually on core defence requirements and related spending by 2035. This includes allocating at least 3.5% of GDP to resource core defence requirements. The UK also decided to join NATO's nuclear mission, acquiring F-35A jets capable of carrying U.S. B61-12 nuclear bombs. (NATO, Hedgeye, July 2025)

Friendship UK-Germany **Cooperation Treaty:** Signed on July 17, 2025, this treaty includes 17 priority projects, with a strong focus on defence cooperation. Key areas include advancing a new Deep Precision Strike capability within the European Long Range Strike Approach (ELSA), coordinating uncrewed aerial systems development, strengthening Eastern Flank defence through a new Land Strategic Partnership (including BOXER cooperation), and enhanced undersea cooperation Northern in the (Bundesregierung.de, GOV.UK, July 17, 2025)

US-India Defence Framework: The US and India have agreed to sign a new 10-year US-India Defence Framework by this year, following





discussions between US Secretary of Defence Pete Hegseth and Indian Union Minister Rajnath Singh. The framework aims to deepen defence partnership, strengthen cooperation in capacity building, industrial collaboration, logistics sharing, and increased joint military exercises. (The Indian EYE, July 3, 2025)

II. Defence Technology and Innovation

India's Indigenous Drone Development: Two 20-year-old engineering students from BITS Pilani's Hyderabad campus have developed and sold cutting-edge, radar-proof Kamikaze drones to Indian Army units. These drones can reach speeds over 300kmph and deliver 1kg payloads with pinpoint accuracy, aiming to reduce India's dependency on imported drones. (Times of India, July 22, 2025)

Australian NASAMS First Firing: The Australian Army's National Advanced Surface to Air Missile System (NASAMS) successfully fired two AIM-Medium-Range Air-to-Air 120 Advanced Missiles during Exercise Talisman Sabre 2025. This marks a significant step forward for Australia's air and missile defence capabilities. (Defence.gov.au, July 22, 2025)

French Medium-Range Ballistic Missile (MBT) Development: ArianeGroup has debuted designs for a conventionally armed mediumrange ballistic missile (MBT), a potential answer to Europe's long-range strike capability gap. This development is being considered as part of the European Long-range Strike Approach (ELSA) framework, which aims to jointly develop indigenous long-range strike capabilities. (IISS, July 21, 2025)

Indian Army's **High-Tech** Modernisation Roadmap: The Indian Army has outlined sweeping modernization plans, seeking private sector involvement for developing hypersonic weapons. soldier systems, autonomous platforms, and integrated cyber, space, and electronic warfare capabilities. This includes investment in directed energy weapons for defence. drone missile and (Indian Masterminds, July 5, 2025)

Uncrewed Naval Systems (UNS): The market for Uncrewed Naval Systems is projected to soar, driven by geopolitical threats. UNS 2025, an event in July, is exploring their deployment for intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance, minecountermeasures, anti-submarine warfare, and search and rescue operations. (Defender Media, July 5, 2025)

AI in Defence: Artificial Intelligence continues to be a top military technology trend, enhancing computational reasoning for ISR (Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance) missions, empowering autonomous weapon systems, and enabling predictive maintenance. Startups are developing self-organizing AI systems for military use and high-performance AI models for detecting explosive objects in imagery. (StartUs Insights, July 5, 2025; Defender Media, July 5, 2025)

III. Other Defence-Related Events

Garden Reach Launches Eighth Anti-Submarine Warfare Ship for Indian Navy: Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd. launched the eighth and final ship in a series of anti-submarine warfare shallow water crafts for the Indian Navy. Named "Ajay," these versatile ships are designed for coastal operations, low-
