Prime Minister's Activities: PM Narendra Modi is scheduled to hold bilateral talks with his Mauritian counterpart, Navinchandra Ramgoolam, in Varanasi. The PM also conducted an aerial survey of flood-hit areas in Punjab and Himachal Pradesh, as an AAP MP, Sanjay Singh, demanded a ₹20,000 crore relief package from the central government.

Vice-Presidential Election: C.P. Radhakrishnan won the Vice Presidential election by 152 votes, securing 452 votes against 300. He called it a triumph of "nationalistic ideology" and pledged to work towards a developed India by 2047. The Congress has accused the BJP of "vote theft" in this election.

Cabinet Decisions: The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by the Prime Minister, has approved two significant infrastructure projects: a ₹3,169 crore project to double the Bhagalpur-Dumka-Rampurhat rail line, and the construction of a four-lane, access-controlled Mokama-Munger section of the Buxar-Bhagalpur High-Speed Corridor in Bihar.

Law and Governance: The President of India has given assent to a Manipur law aimed at regulating the issuance of caste certificates for Scheduled Caste and Other Backward Class communities. The Supreme Court is also examining the timelines for the President and Governors to act on state legislature bills.

Social and Economic News

Nepal Unrest: The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has issued a travel advisory urging Indian citizens to avoid non-essential travel to Nepal due to ongoing unrest. Security has been heightened in border districts of Uttar Pradesh.

Economic Forecast: Fitch Ratings has raised India's GDP growth forecast for 2025-26 to 6.9%, citing strong domestic demand and improved services activity.

Educational Updates: The Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) has released the official notification for the Bihar Secondary Teacher Eligibility Test (STET) 2025, with online applications starting today, September 11th. Additionally, schools and colleges in specific districts of Tamil Nadu are closed to observe Emanuel Sekaran's Remembrance Day.

Humanitarian Concerns: A report from The Hindu newspaper reveals that at least 15 Indian nationals, who were duped by an agent, are reportedly being forced to serve on the Russian side in the Ukraine-Russia war zone.

Other Important News

Cultural Heritage: An international conference on Indian manuscripts, part of the "Gyan Bharatam Mission," is set to begin in New Delhi. The event aims to bring together over 1,100 scholars to support the preservation and digitization of India's vast manuscript heritage.

Public Health: AIIMS New Delhi has launched "Never Alone," an AI-based mental health program to combat student suicides, offering round-the-clock expert support via a web app accessible on WhatsApp. A recent study also suggests that patient perceptions are driving the frivolous use of antibiotics in India.

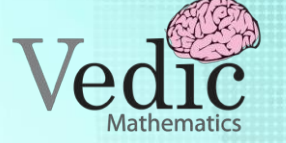
