


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
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Today in History on 03 APR

> 2016: West Indies defeated England at Eden Gardens Ground in Kolkata to win the BCCI T20 World Cup.

The Caribbean team defeated England by four wickets in a thrilling match played at Eden Gardens Stadium in Kolkata on Sunday. With this victory, West Indies became the first team to win the World T20 title for the second time. Earlier, after losing the toss, the English team had set a target of 156 runs for West Indies.



➤ 2010: Apple launches its first iPad.

In 2010, Apple announced and unveiled the first iPad on January 27, followed by an April 3 release in the US for the Wi-Fi model and later for the Wi-Fi + 3G model. The original iPad had a 9.7-inch display, Apple's custom A4 chip, and ran on the iPadOS operating system. The iPad revolutionized the tablet market and was met with much excitement and anticipation.



1999: India launched the first global telecommunication satellite INSAT-1E.

On 3 April 1999, India launched the first global telecommunication satellite INSAT 1E. In 1984, Rakesh Sharma became the first Indian astronaut to go to space on the Russian spacecraft Soyuz T 11. In 1999, India launched the first global telecommunication satellite multipurpose satellite for telecommunication, television broadcasting and meteorological services.







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1973: The first public mobile telephone call is made from a Manhattan sidewalk. Martin Cooper of Motorola calls Joel Engel of Bell Labs.

On April 3, 1973, Martin Cooper of Motorola made the first public mobile telephone call from a Manhattan sidewalk, to Joel Engel of Bell Labs. In the fifty years since that first call, Cooper's bulky device has evolved and been replaced by a wide range of thinner, faster phones.



1933: Aircraft flew for the first time over Mount Everest.

In 1933, on April 3, two Westland aircraft flew for the first time over Mount Everest, a historic moment. Lord Clydesdale flew a modified Westland PV-3 biplane with Colonel Stewart Blacker. Following them were Flight Lieutenant David McIntyre and photographer SR Bonnet in a Westland PV-6. This flight would not only test the mechanical capabilities of both aircraft at high altitudes, but also the pilots' endurance in thin and cold air.




The Great Conciliator A Book On Lal Bahadur Shastri Sanjeev Chopra's book, The Great Conciliator:





Anant Panghal won the bronze medal by defeating Meng H Hsieh of Taipei on the basis of technical superiority in the 53kg category. Indian wrestlers have won one gold, one silver and six bronze medals, including two in Greco-Roman wrestling.

The central government has notified the increase in wage rates under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (NREGS) for the financial year 2025-26. The increase ranges from 2.33% to 7.48%, increasing the wage rate from ₹7 to ₹26 per day, varying by state. This is the first time that NREGS wages have reached ₹400 per day in a state, with Haryana registering the highest increase









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of ₹26 per day. At the same time, Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Nagaland and Telangana have seen the lowest increase of \mathbf{T} 7.

Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO)'s Cartosat-3 satellite took high-resolution images of earthquake damage in Myanmar. Myanmar was hit by a 7.7 magnitude earthquake. Post-disaster images were compared with data from before the event to assess the damage in Mandalay and Sagaing. Cartosat-3 is a third-generation agile advanced earth observation satellite developed by ISRO. It replaces the Indian Remote Sensing (IRS) series and has highresolution imaging capabilities. It was launched by Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV-C47).

Meanwhile, world No. 64 Karim El Torkhi of Egypt defeated India's Abhay Singh in the men's final. The event, with a prize money of \$53,500, was the highest-rated PSA tournament in India since 2018 and the first PSA Copper event held in the country.
