
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Today in History on 05 APR

> 2008 -Parvathy Omanakuttan becomes Femina Miss India World.

In 2008, Parvathy Omanakuttan was crowned Femina Miss India World, and was the first runnerup in the Miss World pageant. Parvathy has also worked in the entertainment and modelling industry and continues to inspire people through her work and activism. Parvathy was crowned the first Pantaloons Femina Miss India South 2008 at the pageant held at the Hyderabad International Convention Centre in December 2007.

> 1979 - The country's first naval museum opens in Mumbai.

In 1979, India's first naval museum, the Ballard Bunder Gatehouse Navy Museum, opened in Mumbai, showcasing India's maritime history. The museum is a two-storey structure with a crenellated roof and a veranda on all sides, made of basalt and

limestone, and decorated with coloured glass windows and murals. The museum has a fascinating collection that takes you on a journey through maritime history.



Navy celebrated National Maritime Day for the first time.

National Maritime Day was celebrated for the first time in India on 5 April 1964 to commemorate the historic voyage of India's first indigenous ship SS Loyalty which sailed from Mumbai to London in 1919. This was a major milestone in India's maritime industry, breaking the British monopoly on maritime trade.





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1949 - The Bharat Scouts and Guides is founded.

The Bharat Scouts and Guides (BSG) is the national Scouting and Guiding association of India. The national headquarters of the BSG is recognised by the Government of India. Scouting was founded in India in 1909 as an overseas branch of the Scout Association and became a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement in 1938. Guiding in India began in 1911 and was one of the founding members of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts in 1928, which at the time also covered present-day Bangladesh and Pakistan.



> 1955- Winston Churchill resigns as British Prime Minister.

In 1955, on April 5, Winston Churchill resigned as British Prime Minister for health reasons, and was replaced by Anthony Eden. One of the most important figures of the 20th century, Churchill remains popular in Britain and the rest of the Anglosphere. He is generally seen as a victorious wartime leader who played an integral role in defending liberal democracy against the spread of fascism.

Free Bus Service for Women in Jammu & Kashmir

On April, 2025, the Jammu and Kashmir government launched a free bus service for women, aimed at promoting gender-inclusive mobility. Flagged off by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, the service allows women to travel for free on smart city e-buses and JKRTC buses across the Union Territory. The initiative includes 200 e-buses in urban areas and 235 JKRTC buses in the Kashmir and Jammu regions.



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Maharashtra Governor \mathbf{C} P Radhakrishnan **Inaugurates** 62nd National Maritime Day and Merchant Navy Week

The 62nd National Maritime Day and Merchant Navy Week were inaugurated by Maharashtra Governor C P Radhakrishnan at Raj Bhavan, Mumbai, on April 5, 2024, emphasizing India's maritime sector's role in Viksit Bharat (Developed India). The Governor highlighted the need for port modernization and better coordination among key organizations like the Directorate General of Shipping, SCI, Indian Railways, and exporters to boost global trade and strengthen India's maritime infrastructure.



> RBI Revises Norms on Government-**Guaranteed Security Receipts**

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has issued new guidelines for Government of India-guaranteed Security Receipts (SRs) by Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs) to enhance bad loan resolution and financial stability. Key provisions include reversal of excess provisions to P&L accounts, stricter capital treatment by deducting non-cash SRs from CET1 capital, and a revised valuation methodology requiring periodic valuation based on Net Asset Value (NAV) and recovery ratings.



Transition ➤ RBI's of Urban operative Banks (UCBs) to the PCA Framework

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will transition 500 financially weak Urban Co-operative Banks (UCBs) from the Supervisory Action Framework (SAF) to the Prompt Corrective Action (PCA) framework starting April, 2025. This shift aims to enhance regulatory oversight, ensure early intervention, and restore financial stability.





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Aditya Birla Capital Merged With Aditya Birla Finance Ltd.

Aditya Birla Capital Limited (ABCL) has successfully amalgamated its NBFC subsidiary Aditya Birla Finance Ltd. (ABFL), effective April, 2025, after approvals from SEBI, RBI, NCLT, shareholders, and creditors. The merger aims to simplify the corporate structure, enhance financial stability, and improve efficiency. Vishakha Mulye has been appointed as MD & CEO, while Rakesh Singh will serve as Executive Director & CEO (NBFC).



Sivasubramanian Ramann Appointed as New Chairperson of PFRDA

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has appointed Sivasubramanian Ramann as the new Chairperson of the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA) for a five-year tenure. Currently serving as Deputy CAG and Chief Technology Officer at CAG of India, Ramann will oversee India's pension sector, including the National Pension System (NPS) and Atal Pension Yojana (APY).



Nikhil Singhal Honored with Uttar Pradesh Anmol Ratan Award

Nikhil Singhal, Founder of Vigor Media Worldwide and President of the Noida High Rise Federation, received the Uttar Pradesh Anmol Ratan Award at the Taj Lucknow on March, 2025, organized by the Tapasya Foundation Trust. SpaceX has achieved another historic milestone as it successfully launched the FRAM2 mission, the first human space mission to Earth's polar orbit. Launched on a Falcon 9 rocket from NASA's Kennedy Space Center, the mission, consisting of an allcivilian team, will spend three to five days in space in a 90-degree polar orbit. The mission aims to advance human space research by conducting 22 scientific experiments, including the first X-ray test in space and a study of growing mushrooms in microgravity.
