> 1984: Scientists discover the AIDScausing virus.

In 1984, scientists discovered the AIDS-causing virus, the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). This discovery helped greatly improve our understanding of AIDS, leading to improved treatment and prevention strategies. Following this discovery, there was a revolution in our understanding of AIDS. HIV was identified as the primary cause of AIDS, leading researchers to explore new methods of treatment and prevention.



Soviet 1981: conducted Union underground nuclear tests.

The Soviet Union conducted underground nuclear tests in 1981. This was part of a series of 21 nuclear tests conducted in 1981. The Soviet Union conducted a total of 21 tests in this test series, which were conducted at the Semipalatinsk test site. The first Soviet test was conducted on August 29, 1949, using a plutonium device (known in the West as Joe-1) with a capacity of about 20 kilotons. The Fat Man bomb was tested at Trinity and dropped on Nagasaki

In 1858, on April 26, Babu Veer Kunwar Singh of Jagdishpur, hero India's First War Independence, died. He was one of the main leaders of Bihar in the 1857 revolt, and played an important role against the British. On April 23, 1858, Kunwar Singh fought his last battle against the British near Jagdishpur. Kunwar Singh is remembered as a great warrior of India's First War of Independence.



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1661: British monarch Charles II is crowned King of **England** Westminster Abbey.

23 April 1661 - Charles II is crowned King of England at Westminster Abbey. Charles II was restored to the throne following the Restoration of the monarchy in 1660. On 29 May 1660, he returned to London on his 30th birthday and was proclaimed king. The coronation of Charles II in 1661 took place at Westminster Abbey. The event marks the Restoration of the monarchy and the beginning of Charles II's reign.

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


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Bihar's Mahila Samvad Campaign: Empowering Women Through Dialogue and Awareness

SECL Pioneers Paste Fill Technology for Sustainable Coal Mining in India


