Today in History on 02 July

1949: Vietnam received international recognition.

It first received international recognition in 1949 as the State of Vietnam within the French Union, with its capital at Saigon, before becoming a republic in 1955. The country was renamed the "Republic of Vietnam" in 1955. Its capital was Saigon. South Vietnam was bordered by North Vietnam to the north, Laos to the northwest, Cambodia to the southwest, Thailand across the Gulf of Thailand to the southwest, and the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, and Indonesia across the South China Sea to the east and southeast.

> 1897: Guglielmo Marconi receives a patent for radio.

Guglielmo Giovanni Maria Marconi, 1st Marquess of Marconi, was an electrical engineer, inventor, and politician best known for his creation of a practical radio wave-based wireless telegraph system. This

led to Marconi being credited as the inventor of radio. Marconi was also an entrepreneur and businessman who founded the Wireless Telegraph & Signal Company (later known as the Marconi Company) in the United Kingdom in 1897.



1983: The first unit of the nuclear power station started operating at

Kalpakkam on this day.

The Madras Atomic Power Station (MAPS), located at Kalpakkam, about 80 kilometres (50 mi) south of Chennai, India, is a comprehensive nuclear power generation, fuel reprocessing and waste treatment facility that includes plutonium fuel fabrication for fast breeder reactors (FBRs). It is also India's first fully indigenously built nuclear power station, with two units generating 220 MW of power. The station's first and second units became critical in 1983 and 1985, respectively.

1985: Andrei Gromyko is elected President of the Soviet Union.

Andrei Andreyevich Gromyko was a Soviet politician and diplomat during the Cold War. He served as Foreign Minister (1957–1985) and Chairman of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet (1985-1988). Gromyko was responsible for many top decisions on Soviet foreign policy until he retired in 1988. In the 1940s, Western pundits called him Mr. Nyet ("Mr. No"), or Grim Grom, because of his frequent use of the Soviet veto in the United Nations Security Council.



> 1962: The first Walmart store opens in Rogers, Arkansas.

On July 2, 1962, Sam Walton opens the first Walmart store in Rogers, Arkansas. The Walton family owns 24 stores with sales of \$12.7 million. The company officially incorporates as Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., with the goal of providing quality goods at low prices. His vision and inspiration made Walmart the world's largest retailer and provides value to millions of customers every day, helping them save money and live better lives.



G7 Nations Agree to Exempt U S Firms from Global Minimum Tax

In a significant policy shift, the Group of Seven (G7) nations have agreed to exempt U.S. multinational companies from the global minimum tax framework, offering them a special "side-by-side" taxation solution. The arrangement, pushed by U.S. President Donald Trump's administration, will ensure that American corporations are taxed solely by the United States on both domestic and foreign profits, potentially reshaping the global tax architecture negotiated under the OECD framework since 2021.




