In 1924, Netherlands refused to recognise the Soviet Union. Recognition of Soviet Union: Many countries recognised the Soviet Union, but the United States did not recognise the Soviet Union. Canada recognises Soviet Union: On March 27, Canada formally recognised the Soviet Union.



1933: Hitler bans labor unions in Germany.

In 1933, after Adolf Hitler came to power, the Nazi Party banned labor unions. This action was taken on May 2, 1933, when the SA and police occupied the offices of German labor unions. The Nazi Party abolished the labor unions, preventing them from organizing organized opposition against the Nazi government. With this action, the Nazi government tried to eliminate organized opposition from the working class. The Nazi Party also banned all nonNazi political parties and turned Germany into a totalitarian regime.



1945: German troops Italy surrender.

In 1945, German troops in Italy surrendered on May 2. This surrender was to the Allies and was an important step towards the end of World War II. With this surrender, the Allies defeated the German army in Italy. 5 days later, on May 7, 1945, Germany surrendered unconditionally to the Western Allies, ending the war in Europe. 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


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➤ India Post Partners with SBI Mutual Fund to Streamline KYC

It highlights that the richest 1% hold more wealth than 95% of the global population, and calls for a rebuilding of social contracts, fair taxation, and stronger institutions to meet the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), especially in health, education, poverty reduction, and inequality.



Green Hydrogen Certification Scheme Launched By MNRE Minister

Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) held a National Workshop in New Delhi to promote MSME participation in the Green Hydrogen Supply Chain. Union Minister Pralhad Joshi launched the Green Hydrogen Certification Scheme (GHCI), a key initiative to ensure traceability and transparency in green hydrogen production. The event featured









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technical sessions on technology collaboration, biomass-based hydrogen, investments, and supply chain opportunities.



Welfare for announcement government employees Tamil Nadu Government

The Tamil Nadu Chief Minister has made nine announcements in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly for the welfare of the State government's Police staff. The first announcement is the earned leave surrender, starting from October 1, up to 15 days of earned leave can be surrendered for a cash benefit. Based on the Central Government's decision to increase DA by 2 per cent from January 2025, the State Government will also increase the DA by 2% from the same date for state government employees.



The Draft of Greenhouse Emissions Intensity (GEI) Target Rules, 2025

The Draft Greenhouse Gases Emissions Intensity (GEI) Target Rules, 2025, issued by the Ministry of Environment on April, 2025, aim to regulate GHG emissions intensity in high-emission industries like cement, aluminium, pulp & paper, and chlor-alkali. These rules support India's Carbon Credit Trading Scheme, 2023, and are key to meeting the Paris Agreement commitment of a 45% reduction in emissions intensity of GDP by 2030.







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Supreme Court Suggests Minimum Vote Requirement for Unopposed **Election Wins**

The Supreme Court of India has suggested that candidates declared elected unopposed under Section 53(2) of the RPA, 1951 should secure a minimum percentage of votes (10-15%) to maintain democratic legitimacy. This came in response to a petition by Vidhi Centre, which argued that denying voters the NOTA option violates Article 19(1)(a). The Election Commission opposed the petition, citing the rarity of such cases post-1989 and asserting that any changes would need legislative amendments.




