Today in History on 17 MAY

> 1498: Vasco da Gama anchored for the first time near Calicut.

In 1498, Vasco da Gama anchored for the first time near Calicut. On May, 1498, Vasco da Gama's fleet arrived near Calicut (now Kozhikode in the state of Kerala), located on the Malabar coast (present-day Kerala state of India). The king of Calicut, Zamorin, gave Vasco da Gama a warm welcome. Zamorin gave Vasco da Gama the title of "Dom" and agreed to enter into a trade treaty with him.



> 1540: Sher Shah defeats Humayun at Hardoi.

In 1540, Sher Shah defeats Humayun, the battle took place at Kannauj (Bilgram), which is in Uttar Pradesh. After this defeat, Humayun was exiled from India and Sher Shah established his rule over North India. Humayun's defeat weakened the Mughal Empire and temporarily ended Mughal rule in India.

Sher Shah captured Delhi and established the Sur Empire in North India.



> 1975 - Japanese woman Mrs. Junko Tabei became the first woman to climb Mount Everest.

On May 1975, Japanese woman Junko Tabei became the first woman to climb the peak of Mount Everest. She, along with her team, overcame many challenges and with strong willpower, achieved the incredible feat of reaching the summit of Mount Everest. Her achievement made her an inspiration, which inspires women to pursue mountaineering.



Andhra Pradesh government announces property tax exemption for defence personnel living in villages

In a significant move in honour of India's armed forces, Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan announced full property tax exemption for houses owned by active defence personnel located in gram panchayat areas across the state. The move is an extension of the earlier benefit limited only to retired servicemen or those posted in border areas, and now applies to all active personnel, regardless of their current posting.



US-China agree to cut tariffs to ease trade war tensions

In a significant development towards global economic stability, the United States and China have agreed to cut reciprocal tariffs by 115% under a 90day ceasefire in their long-running trade war. The deal, finalised after high-level talks between US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessant and Chinese Vice Premier He Lifeng in Geneva, is a major step towards easing tensions between the world's two largest economies.

Retired 1985 batch IAS officer of Kerala cadre and former Defence Secretary Ajay Kumar has been appointed as the Chairman of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). With vast experience in defence reforms and digital governance, his appointment was approved by President Draupadi Murmu and will fill the vacancy created after the completion of Preeti Sudan's term on April, 2025.



Cabinet approves Rs 3,706 crore HCL-Foxconn chip plant at Jewar

In a significant move towards self-reliance in semiconductor manufacturing, the government has approved ₹3,706 crore to a joint venture (JV) of HCL and Foxconn to set up a semiconductor assembly and packaging plant at Jewar in Uttar Pradesh. This is the sixth project under India's ₹76,000 crore Semiconductor Mission and will be the first such plant in Uttar Pradesh. It is expected to start production in 2027 and will create around 2,000 jobs and contribute to meeting 40% of India's chip demand.



India wins 7 medals at Archery World Cup 2025

India performed brilliantly at the Archery World Cup Stage 2 held in Shanghai, winning a total of 7 medals, including 2 gold, 1 silver and 4 bronze. Star archer Deepika Kumari returned to the international stage to win her 18th World Cup medal, while young talent Parth Salunkhe won his first bronze medal at the

senior level, showcasing India's growing strength and depth.



> T.N. government extends V-C search panel is term for four universities

The Tamil Nadu government, through a series of notifications dated May, 2025, has extended the time limit for the search committees to chose Vice-Chancellors to four State universities to August 13, 2025. It has also made amendments to the original notifications for the search committees, omitting the provisions where the committees submit their recommendations to the Governor-Chancellor. Instead, the search committees for Anna University, Madurai Kamaraj University, Annamalai University, and Tamil Nadu Teachers' Education University will submit their recommendations directly to the government.
