Today in History on 22 MAY

> 1963: India's first glider Rohini took off.

On May 22, 1963, India soared into the aviation history books with the first flight of the Rohini glider. Developed by the Civil Aviation Department, the RG-1 Rohini represented a leap forward in indigenous aerospace design, marking the nation's burgeoning aspirations in aeronautical engineering.



1972: Pakistan from resigns Commonwealth membership.

In 1972, Pakistan resigned its membership from the Commonwealth. This decision was taken over the issue of independence of East Pakistan, which later became Bangladesh. Later, in 1989, Pakistan reentered the Commonwealth. In 1971, East Pakistan gained independence as Bangladesh, following which Pakistan resigned from the Commonwealth.




1984: Bachendri Pal became the first Indian woman to conquer the world's highest peak, Everest.

In 1984, Bachendri Pal created history by conquering Mount Everest, becoming the first Indian woman to do so. She achieved this feat on 23 May 1984, when she hoisted the tricolour on the summit of Everest as part of India's first mixed gender team. She led several adventure expeditions, including the Women's Mount "Indo-Nepalese Expedition", "The Great Indian Women's Rafting Voyage", and the "First Indian Women's Trans-Himalayan Expedition".

1988: India successfully tested the indigenously developed intercontinental ballistic missile Agni.

Agni V is India's intercontinental ballistic missile. It has been developed by the Defense Research and Development Organization. This 17 meter long and two meter wide Agni-5 missile made with ultramodern technology is capable of carrying 1 ton payload equipped with nuclear weapons.



> 1990: The Republic of Yemen emerged with the merger of North and South Yemen.

In 1990, the Republic of Yemen emerged with the merger of North Yemen (Yemen Arab Republic) and People's Democratic South Yemen (Yemen Republic). This merger united two separate countries, which were previously part of different blocs during the Cold War. This unification took place on 22 May 1990.

launches > Tripura Vikasit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan to empower farmers

Taking a significant step towards increasing agricultural productivity and farmer welfare, the Tripura government has announced the launch of "Vikasit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan" which will run from May 29 to June 12, 2025. The campaign is part of an initiative of the Union Agriculture Ministry aimed at increasing awareness about state and centrally sponsored schemes in rural areas and gram panchayats, increasing agricultural production and reducing costs.

China and Cambodia launch "Golden Dragon-2025" to boost military ties

China and Cambodia launched the "Golden Dragon-2025" joint military exercise in mid-May 2025, marking a major expansion in the size, scope and technical sophistication of the two countries' bilateral defense cooperation. This time the exercise involves cutting-edge unmanned warfare systems and covers land, maritime and air operations. It aims to strengthen strategic coordination, humanitarian assistance and counter-terrorism capabilities.



Sudan appoints Kamil Idris as first PM since 2023 civil war

Sudan's army chief General Abdel-Fattah al-Burhan appointed Kamil al-Taeb Idris as the country's new prime minister on May 2025, the first time the position has been filled since the civil war began in April 2023. The move is seen as a significant initiative towards political stability, especially after the re-establishment of military control over Khartoum.



➤ RBI cancels HCBL Co-operative Bank's license due to lack of capital

The license of Lucknow-based urban cooperative bank HCBL Co-operative Bank was canceled by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on May 2025. The bank had insufficient capital and was unlikely to operate financially sustainable. With this, all banking operations of the bank have been stopped with immediate effect. The Registrar of Cooperative Societies of Uttar Pradesh has been directed to start the liquidation of the bank and appoint a liquidator.



India prepares new sea route to Northeast via Myanmar, bypassing Bangladesh

India is set to redefine connectivity for its northeastern states with the development of a high-speed four-lane highway from Shillong to Silchar, which will bypass Bangladesh and integrate with the Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project in Myanmar. This landmark infrastructure initiative will enhance strategic and economic connectivity between the Northeast and Kolkata through the sea, becoming a key link in India's Act East policy.



Negative growth rate in agriculture

Tamil Nadu has experienced a negative growth rate in agriculture and its allied activities during 2024-25, for the first time in eight years. Last year, the growth rate in real terms was minus 0.09%. In the same time, the State had achieved a real economic growth rate of 9.69%.






