Today in History on 23 MAY

> 1923 - Belgium founded Sabena Airlines.

In 1923, Belgium founded the Sabena airline. Sabena was founded as Belgium's national carrier on May 23, 1923, and was already an organization called the Syndicat National pour l'Etude des Transports Aériens (SNETA) which was created in 1919. Sabena operated its first commercial flight from Brussels to London via Ostend on July 1, 1923.



2023 - Neeraj Chopra becomes world number one javelin thrower.

At the 2023 World Championships, Neeraj Chopra won a historic gold medal for India by throwing the javelin 88.17m. Neeraj Chopra won the gold medal at the IAAF World U20 Championships 2016 in Bydgoszcz, Poland. Tokyo Olympics gold medallist Neeraj Chopra has become the first athlete from the country to become the world number one javelin thrower.



1568 - The Netherlands declare their independence from Spain,

In 1568, the Eighty Years' War began, when the Dutch, led by Prince William I of Orange, revolted against the Habsburg Empire, which was ruled by King Philip II of Spain. In 1581, the Seven United Provinces of the Netherlands declared their independence from Spain.



1848 - Otto Lilienthal was born

In 1848, Otto Lilienthal was born. He was a German aviation pioneer known for his flights with gliders.

He was born on May 23, 1848 in Anklam, Germany. Lilienthal began studying the forces acting on wings in the air stream in the late 1870s. The results of that research appeared in 1889 in a book called Der Vogelflug als Grundlage der Fliegekunst ("Bird flight as the basis of aviation") and in an important series of articles that provided a foundation for the eventual attempt to achieve mechanical flight.



> 1934 - Auto-Lite Strike ends with the Battle of Toledo.

In 1934, the Battle of Toledo ended during the Auto-Lite Strike. The strike was started by auto parts workers working at the Electric Auto-Lite Company factories in Toledo, Ohio. The strike was one of the most significant strikes of 1934 and helped popularize the concept of collective bargaining.





Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy launched the 'Indira Solar Giri Jala Vikasam' scheme at Macharam in Amrabad mandal of Nagarkurnool district. The scheme aims to provide irrigation using solar-powered borewells in electricity-less tribal lands. It will cover 6 lakh acres of land of Scheduled Tribe (ST) farmers under the Forest Rights Act (FRA). Farmers with more than 2.5 acres of land will get individual units, while small landholders will form borewell user groups. The tribal welfare department will identify eligible farmers by May 25.
