

Most Important Points Of 06th November in History

- **1876 - Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay composed the song Vande Mataram in a village named Kantal Pada in Bengal.**

Poet and novelist Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay wrote Vande Mataram. The song Vande Mataram was composed on November 1876 in a village named Kantal Pada in Bengal.

Vande Mataram was sung for the first time in the Calcutta session of the Congress in 1896. That is, about 51 years before India got independence.



- **1951 - Constitution passed in Jordan.**

Jordan's first constitution was adopted in 1948. It began the process of creating a national legal system in the post-Ottoman period. Both Jordan's 1948 and 1952 constitutions reaffirmed that Islam is the religion of the state.

The first Jordanian Family Rights Law was enacted in 1947; it was replaced by the Family Rights Law of 1951. The Jordanian Personal Status Law was enacted in 1952.



- **1996 - US space agency NASA launches Mars Global Surveyor.**

Launched on November, 1996, Mars Global Surveyor became the first successful mission to the Red Planet in two decades. After spending a year and a half changing its orbit from a looping ellipse around the planet to a circular track, the spacecraft began its major mapping mission in March 1999.

➤ **1978 - Indira Gandhi was re-elected to the Indian Parliament.**

In the year 1978, Indira Gandhi was re-elected to the Indian Parliament.

Smt. Indira Gandhi, daughter of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, was born on 19 November 1917 in an illustrious family.

In 1955, Mrs. Indira Gandhi became a member of the Congress Working Committee and the Central Election Committee. In 1958, she was appointed as a member of the Central Parliamentary Board of the Congress. She became the Vice-President of the National Integration Council of the AICC and the President of the All India Youth Congress and the AICC Women's Department in 1956.

She was the President of the Indian National Congress from the year 1959 to 1960. She assumed this post again in January 1978.



➤ **1982 - The Constitution was enacted in Turkey.**

The Constitution was enacted in Turkey on November, 1982. This Constitution was approved by 91% of the voters. This Constitution replaced the first Constitution of 1961.

The Constitution has been amended 21 times, three of them through referendum: 2007, 2010, 2017, one of them partially through referendum: 1987.

➤ **Marine Fisheries Census 2025 Goes Fully Digital with VYAS Apps**

India has taken a significant leap in modernising its marine data infrastructure with the launch of the Marine Fisheries Census (MFC) 2025 — now a fully digital exercise. Unveiled on November, 2025, by Union Minister George Kurian in Kochi, the census integrates real-time data collection, geo-referencing, and drone technology, transforming how India documents and plans for the livelihoods of coastal communities.



Key Points:-

- For the first time, the census has included drone surveillance for aerial mapping of fishing vessels during the trawl ban period.
- Major ports such as Vizag, Kakinada, Tuticorin, Mangaluru and Beypore were surveyed to ensure neutral and verifiable data collection.

➤ **Post Payments Bank & EPFO Launch Free Doorstep Service**

In a move set to enhance ease of living for senior citizens, India Post Payments Bank (IPPB) and the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on November 2025 to provide free doorstep submission of Digital Life Certificates (DLCs) for pensioners under the Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 (EPS-95).



Key Points:-

- The pensioner contacts their local Postman or Gramin Dak Sevak, or visits the nearest Post Office.
- They provide their Aadhaar number and pension details.
- Identity is authenticated via face recognition or fingerprint biometric linked to Aadhaar.
- On successful verification, the Jeevan Pramaan certificate is generated.

➤ Maldives Enacts World's First Generational Smoking Ban

In a globally unprecedented move, the Maldives has implemented a generational smoking ban, prohibiting anyone born after 1 January 2007 from buying, using, or being sold any form of tobacco. Effective November 2025, this policy makes the Indian Ocean island nation the first and only country with such a law in place, reflecting a radical push toward public health protection and youth well-being.



Key Points:-

- Anyone born on or after January 1, 2007, is permanently banned from purchasing or using tobacco products.
- Retailers must verify age before sale; failure to do so will result in a fine of 50,000 Maldivian rufiyaa (about \$3,200).

➤ Vishvajit Sahay Appointed as Controller General of Defence Accounts

Shri Vishvajit Sahay, a senior bureaucrat from the Indian Defence Accounts Service (IDAS), took over as the new Controller General of Defence Accounts (CGDA). This key appointment brings to the helm a civil servant with over 30 years of experience in public administration and defence finance, at a time when the Indian defence sector continues to modernise and expand financially. Shri Vishvajit Sahay is a 1990-batch IDAS officer and an alumnus of St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi. His long administrative career spans critical financial, policy, and planning roles across central ministries and defence establishments.

➤ Jannik Sinner Reclaims World Number 1 with Paris Masters Win

Jannik Sinner has once again climbed to the pinnacle of men's tennis, reclaiming the ATP World Number 1 ranking after a commanding victory over Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 2025 Paris Masters final. With a straight-sets win—6-4, 7-6 (4)—on November, 2025, the Italian tennis star dethroned Carlos Alcaraz and further cemented his dominance in the 2025 indoor season. The Paris Masters, one of the most prestigious ATP 1000 tournaments, served as the stage for Sinner's latest triumph.

➤ **UPI Transactions Hit Record ₹27.28 Lakh Crore in October 2025**

India's digital economy reached a significant milestone in October 2025, with Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transactions hitting a record ₹27.28 lakh crore in value, according to data from the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). With 20.7 billion transactions processed during the month—largely driven by festive shopping during Diwali—this marks the highest ever volume and value in UPI's history, underscoring its role as the backbone of India's digital payments ecosystem.
