

Most Important Points Of 29th November in History

- **1886: The first commercially successful AC electrical power plant was opened.**

1886 - Great Barrington, Massachusetts - The first complete AC power system in the world was demonstrated using step up and step down transformers. The system was built by William Stanley and funded by Westinghouse.



- **1967: The Republic of South Yemen gained independence from the United Kingdom.**

North Yemen gained independence in 1918 and South Yemen in 1967. The two Yemens became a unified nation in 1990.

Although the People's Republic of Southern Yemen gained independence on November 30, 1967, the United States did not recognize it until December 7, when U.S. Consul General in Aden, William L. Eagleton, Jr., informed the new government authorities of the United States' decision. In 1970, the country was renamed the People's Democratic Republic of Yemen.



- **2000: Indian beauty Priyanka Chopra won the Miss World pageant in London.**

Miss World 2000, the 50th edition of the Miss World pageant, was held on November 2000 at the Millennium Dome in London, United Kingdom. The swimsuit segment of the pageant was filmed in the Maldives. Priyanka Chopra of India won the pageant at the age of 18.



Most Important Points Of 29th November in History

- **2004: Bill reserving 45 percent of seats for women passed in Bangladesh Parliament.**

Bangladesh Nationalist Party Law Minister Moudud Ahmed wrote the bill in 2004. The bill would reserve 45 additional seats for women. They would be distributed among political parties in proportion to the number of seats they hold.

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- **2008: Government announces formation of federal investigation agency following Mumbai terror attacks.**

After the November 2008 Mumbai attacks, the Indian government established key institutions and legal frameworks to combat terrorism. On December 17, 2008, the Indian Parliament approved the creation of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), a federal counter-terrorism body similar to the US Federal Bureau of Investigation.

➤ Assam Tables Bill to Ban Polygamy

In a significant move towards personal law reform and women's rights protection, the Assam government introduced The Assam Prohibition of Polygamy Bill, 2025 in the Assembly on November, 2025. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma tabled the bill, fulfilling a promise made in 2023 to eliminate polygamy through legislation. This action follows Assam's earlier initiative to conduct a statewide survey on polygamy in 2023, which indicated the need for a legal framework.



Key Points:-

- The bill reflects Assam's approach to tackling gender inequality and misuse of personal laws, particularly where polygamy has caused distress among women.
- The bill seeks to criminalise polygamy and impose strict penalties for offenders.

➤ Andhra Pradesh Launches 'Rythanna Meekosam' to Empower Farmers

On November, 2025, the Andhra Pradesh government launched a large-scale initiative titled 'Rythanna Meekosam', a farmer-centric programme designed to provide long-term support under a Five-Point Formula. Spearheaded by Agriculture Minister K. Atchannaidu, the program was inaugurated in Krishna district, and will run on November 2025, with workshops scheduled on December 3 at Farmer Service Centres.



Key Points:-

- Drone use for pest control and precision spraying
- Promotion of farm mechanisation to reduce manual labour
- Encouragement of agri-tech solutions at the grassroots level
- The goal is to help farmers increase productivity while reducing costs and physical strain.

➤ Gavi, UNICEF Secure Affordable Malaria Vaccine Deal

On November, 2025, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, and UNICEF announced a breakthrough pricing agreement for the R21/Matrix-M™ malaria vaccine, aimed at drastically expanding access and affordability. With malaria still claiming nearly half a million child deaths each year, this initiative is set to protect 7 million additional children by the end of the decade. The deal is made possible through Gavi's advance financing, backed by the International Finance Facility for Immunisation (IFFIm), which allows long-term donor pledges to be converted into immediate funding.



Key Points:-

- UNICEF, the world's largest vaccine buyer, plays a crucial role in ensuring strategic procurement and manufacturer partnerships.
- In collaboration with Gavi, it supports fair pricing and a secure supply chain of life-saving vaccines.
- UNICEF delivers around three billion doses annually, reaching nearly half of the world's children.

➤ ISSF World Championship Rifle/Pistol 2025 Held in Cairo, Egypt

The ISSF World Championship Rifle/Pistol 2025 was held on November 2025 in Cairo, the capital of Egypt. Organised by the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF), this major international event saw the participation of 720 shooters from 70 National Olympic Committees (NOCs). Competitions were held in both individual and team rifle and pistol events, attracting top marksmen and women from across the world.

➤ India Clinches Women's Kabaddi World Cup Title Again

India's women's kabaddi team delivered another historic performance by winning the Women's Kabaddi World Cup 2025, defeating Chinese Taipei 35–28 in the final held in Dhaka, Bangladesh. With this triumph, India successfully defended its title and cemented its status as a global kabaddi powerhouse.
