➤ 1781: Spanish colonists founded the present-day city of Los Angeles.

Los Angeles was founded in 1781 by Spanish governor Felipe de Neve. After independence from Spain, the city became part of Mexico in 1821, and was purchased by the United States in 1848 under a treaty between the United States and Mexico after the Mexican-American War ended.

of Baroda in 1874. After this, he moved to England, where he continued to advocate for Indian interests.



1888: George Eastman receives a patent for a roll-film camera.

In 1888, George Eastman receives a US patent for his Kodak camera, which was a significant step in making photography accessible to the general public due to its use of roll-film. The famous slogan "You press the button, we do the rest" was coined with this camera, as the customer did not have to deal with the complexities associated with photography. The Kodak camera was a small, box-style device designed to be easy to use. It had pre-loaded film and a simple shutter button, allowing anyone to take a picture.



1825: Dadabhai Naoroji was born.

Dadabhai Naoroji was born on 4 September 1825 and was the first Indian (and thus the first Asian) to be elected to the British Parliament, serving as a member of the House of Commons from 1892 to 1895 and also known as the "Elderly Man of India". Naoroji's early career included serving as the Diwan

1946: Interim Government formed in India.

The Interim Government was formed by the Constituent Assembly of India in 1946. This government was formed to help lead British India towards independence and it functioned until 15 August 1947, when India gained independence and was divided between India and Pakistan. It was formed under the leadership of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and played a key role in the transformation of the country.



> 1985: First photos of the Titanic wreck emerge.

In 1985, a joint US-French expedition led by Dr Robert Ballard experimental used marine technology to locate the Titanic wreck and took the first underwater photographs of it. On September 1, 1985, the team aboard the R/V Knorr spotted a huge boiler on the sea floor, confirming the ship's wreck. These photos confirm the location of the ship, which sank 73 years ago, at a depth of about 13,000 feet.




➤ India Offers 1,000 E-Scholarships to

The move is aimed at unleashing the potential of the sector and boosting its projected 7.1% annual growth.

For the first time in any academic year, the total number of teachers in the country is set to cross the one crore mark in the academic year 2024-25. This has been revealed in a report by the Ministry of Education's Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) on school education in India. According to the report, this is an increase of 6.7 per cent as compared to 2022-23 in the same period. Meanwhile, India currently has around 15 lakh schools with over 24 crore students. Of these, about 50 per cent students are enrolled in government schools, followed by 41 per cent in private schools and the rest in government-aided schools. Moreover, female representation has also increased, with over 54.3 per cent of school teachers being women and the enrolment of girls currently stands at 48.3 per cent.


