➤ 1968 - The African country Swaziland gained independence from Britain.

Swaziland (later renamed eSwatini) gained independence from Britain in 1968. Swaziland gained its independence from the United Kingdom on September 6, 1968, and became a member of the Commonwealth of Nations. In 2018, the country changed its name to eSwatini on its 50th independence anniversary.



➤ 1952 - Canadian TV debuts in Montreal.

Television in Canada began on September 6, 1952 with CBFT in Montreal. Television in Canada officially began in 1952 with the establishment of the country's first television stations in Montreal and Toronto. Like most media in Canada, the television industry and programming available in

that country is heavily influenced by the media of the United States and the United Kingdom, perhaps to an extent not seen in any other major industrialized country. As a result, the government sets quotas for "Canadian content".



➤ 1948 - Juliana becomes Queen of the Netherlands.

Juliana was Queen of the Netherlands from 1948 to 1980. The only child of Queen Wilhelmina and Prince Henry of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, Juliana studied law at Leiden University (1927–30) and in 1931 helped form the National Crisis Committee to promote measures by private enterprise to mitigate the economic depression. She married Prince Bernhard of Lippe-Biesterfeld in 1937 and had four daughters: Beatrix (1938), Irene (1939), Margarethe (1943), and Christina (1947). During World War II, Juliana took refuge in Ottawa while her husband remained with Queen Wilhelmina's government, which had relocated to London.





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➤ 1914 - Battle of the Marne begins between France and Germany.

The Battle of the Marne was fought between France and Germany in 1914, which was an important battle of World War I and lasted from 5 to 12 September 1914. The battle succeeded in pushing the German army back, which marked the beginning of trench warfare in World War I. The German army aimed to capture Paris and quickly defeat France, but this battle stopped their progress. The German army had to retreat from Paris and this marked the beginning of trench warfare in the war.



➤ 1939 - South Africa declares war on Nazi Germany.

In 1939 South Africa declared war on Nazi Germany. The declaration was made on 6 September 1939, shortly after Britain and France declared war on Germany in response to the German invasion of Poland. South Africa, being part of the British Empire, joined the war against Nazi Germany on 6 September 1939, siding with Britain and the Allies.

➤ Next-Gen GST Reforms – Old vs New Rates

On September 2025, the 56th GST Council Meeting marked a historic reform in India's taxation system,





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presenting what is being called a “Next-Gen GST”. Branded as a Diwali gift for the nation, these reforms are designed to ease the burden on households, boost agriculture, empower MSMEs, uplift healthcare, and make automobiles affordable. The changes aim to simplify compliance, cut down costs for citizens, and support India’s vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat.



➤ India-Japan Joint Credit Mechanism for Climate Action

India and Japan have signed a Joint Credit Mechanism (JCM) agreement under Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement. The move aims to boost carbon trading, attract green investment, and foster sustainable innovation. Signed amid US tariffs on Indian goods and China’s rare earth restrictions, the pact gives India a strategic alternative to strengthen its manufacturing and clean energy future.



➤ Nomination of members to NDMA

Prime Minister nominated two new members and renominated three existing members to the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). Scientist Dinesh Kumar Aswal and disaster recovery specialist Rita Missal were nominated as new members of the NDMA. Rajendra Singh, Krishna Swaroop Vatsa, and Lieutenant General Syed Ata Hasnain (Retired) were renominated for another three-year term.

➤ Dr Deepak Mittal Appointed India’s New Envoy to UAE

India has named seasoned diplomat Dr Deepak Mittal as its next Ambassador to the United Arab





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Emirates (UAE), further reinforcing the strategic and people-centric bond between the two nations. A 1998-batch Indian Foreign Service officer, Dr Mittal brings with him a wealth of diplomatic experience and strategic insight, having served in key positions in the Prime Minister's Office and abroad.



➤ World Boxing Championships Kick Off in Liverpool

The World Boxing Championships begin tomorrow in Liverpool, United Kingdom, marking the first edition under the aegis of the newly formed governing body, World Boxing. For the first time, the event will feature both men's and women's competitions together, making it a landmark edition. India enters the tournament with a mix of seasoned champions and fresh talent, aiming to replicate its strong performances from 2023.



➤ GST Council: Constitutional Provisions and Functions

The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council is the apex decision-making body for matters related to GST in India. It was established through the 101st Constitutional Amendment Act, 2016, under Article 279A, to create a harmonized tax structure across the country. As a constitutional body, the Council ensures cooperative federalism by bringing together the Union and State governments to decide on crucial aspects of GST policy, rates, exemptions, and administration.



➤ DGP Appointment in Tamil Nadu

Senior Indian Police Service Officer G Venkatraman has been appointed as the Director-General of Police in charge of Tamil Nadu. He assumed office on August, 2025, succeeding Shankar Jiwal. He will hold office until a regular Director-General of Police is appointed.

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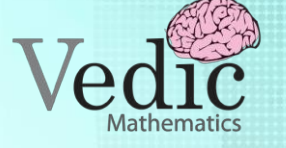

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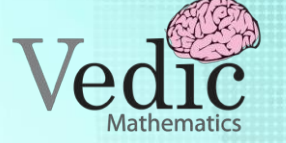

The National Annual Report and Index on Women's Safety (NARI) 2025 was released by the National Commission for Women (NCW). The survey covered 12,770 women across 31 cities in India. The national safety score is 65%, which means that 40% of women feel unsafe despite government assurances. 60% of women reported feeling safe, while 14% of women under the age of 24 reported harassment, which is double the national average. Kohima, Visakhapatnam, Bhubaneswar, Aizawl, Gangtok, Itanagar and Mumbai are the safest cities. Patna, Jaipur, Faridabad, Delhi, Kolkata, Srinagar and Ranchi are the least safe cities. The report presents women's safety as a developmental issue, which includes physical, psychological, financial and digital security.

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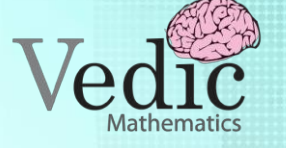
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
