Services defeated Kerala to win the Santosh Trophy for the 8th time.



The 79th National Football Championship for the Santosh Trophy reached a dramatic conclusion on February 8, 2026, as Services clinched their 8th title by defeating Kerala 1-0 in an grueling final.

The match, held at the jam-packed Dhakuakhana Football Stadium in Assam, was a classic tactical battle that required more than 90 minutes to separate the two domestic giants.

The Decisive Moment

After a goalless regulation time and a cagey first half of extra time, the deadlock was finally broken in the 109th minute.

- **The Goal:** Substitute **Shubham Rana** delivered a pinpoint cross from the left flank. Kerala's goalkeeper, Hajmal S, fisted the ball away, but it fell to the edge of the box.
- **The Hero:** Striker **Abhishek Pawar** swivelled and unleashed a low right-footed strike that skidded through the defense and into the net. This was Pawar's 7th goal of the tournament, cementing his status as one of

Why This Victory is Historic

- Breaking the Tie:** Both Services and Kerala entered the final as seven-time champions. This win allows Services to move ahead with **8 titles**, trailing only West Bengal (32) and Punjab (8—now tied).

Japan PM Sanae Takaichi Wins Landslide in 2026 General Election



The historic electoral victory of Sanae Takaichi on February 8, 2026, marks a watershed moment in Japanese history. Not only has she solidified her mandate as Japan's first female Prime Minister, but she has also led the Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) to its most dominant performance in seven decades.

The scale of this victory—securing a **two-thirds supermajority**—is a rare feat in parliamentary democracy and fundamentally reshapes the legislative landscape.

By the Numbers: The 2026 Landslide

The election results for the 465-member House of Representatives are record-breaking:

- **Overriding the Upper House:** Takaichi can now pass budgets and laws even if the Upper House (where the LDP lacks a majority) rejects them.
- **Committee Control:** The LDP now chairs all 17 standing committees, allowing them to set the legislative agenda without opposition interference.
- **Constitutional Reform:** This majority is the prerequisite for Takaichi's long-standing goal of revising **Article 9** (the pacifist clause) of the Constitution.

Perspective: This victory effectively ends the "revolving door" era of Japanese Prime Ministers. Takaichi now has the political capital to pursue a hawkish security agenda and significant economic restructuring without the usual intra-party constraints.

The "Sana-mania" Factor

Political analysts attribute this "electoral reversal" to Takaichi's personal branding rather than just party loyalty.

- **The Youth Vote:** Her aggressive digital campaign and "work, work, work" mantra successfully appealed to voters under 40

Manu Bhaker Clinches Silver in 25m Pistol at Asian Shooting Championships 2026



Manu Bhaker's performance at the Asian Shooting Championships 2026 was a masterclass in mental resilience. Competing at the Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Range in New Delhi, she successfully turned a disappointing start to the tournament into a career milestone.

The 25m pistol final was the most dramatic event of the championship. After the regulation 50 shots, Bhaker was neck-and-neck with Vietnam's Nguyen Thuy Trang.

India's Banks Achieve Record Low NPAs, Signaling Financial Stability



The announcement in Parliament on **February 9, 2026**, regarding the decline of gross Non-

Performing Assets (NPAs) to **2.15%** (as of September 2025) marks a triumphant conclusion to a decade-long "clean-up" of India's banking sector.

For context, this is a staggering drop from the peak of **11.5%** recorded in March 2018. The current level is even healthier than the **2.25% - 2.4%** levels seen in 2010-11, before the "twin balance sheet" crisis began

The Road to 2.15%: Strategic Pillars

The recovery wasn't accidental; it was the result of a coordinated strategy between the RBI and the Government, often referred to as the **4Rs Strategy**:

- Recognition:** The 2015 **Asset Quality Review (AQR)** forced banks to stop "evergreening" bad loans and transparently report them.
- Resolution:** The **Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) 2016** shifted the power from "Debtor-in-Possession" to "Creditor-in-Control," facilitating faster recoveries.
- Recapitalisation:** The government infused massive capital into Public Sector Banks (PSBs) to ensure they could absorb losses and continue lending.
- Reforms:** Strengthening underwriting standards and implementing **Early Warning Systems (EWS)** to detect stress before it turns into an NPA.

Performance by Bank Category (Sept 2025)

The recovery has been broad-based, though Public Sector Banks have shown the most

dramatic improvement relative to their past stress.

- **Credit Growth:** With cleaner balance sheets, banks are more willing to lend to productive sectors like Infrastructure, MSMEs, and Startups.
- **Slippage Control:** The "Slippage Ratio" (fresh bad loans) for PSBs fell to **0.8%**, significantly lower than the **1.8%** seen in private banks, indicating that PSBs have significantly tightened their risk management.

The Big Picture: As of March 2025, the IBC alone had settled over 30,000 applications involving defaults of nearly **₹13.78 lakh crore** at the pre-admission stage, fundamentally changing the credit culture in India.
