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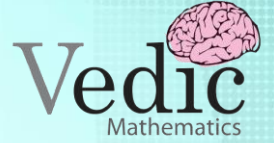

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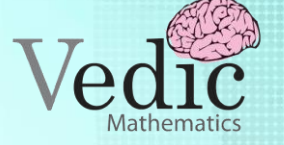

India and Germany Various Pacts On German Chancellor Visit To India

The meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and German Chancellor Friedrich Merz on January 12–13, 2026, in Gandhinagar and





Ahmedabad marks a transformative chapter in the India-Germany relationship.



This visit coincides with the **75th anniversary of diplomatic relations** and the **25th anniversary of their Strategic Partnership**.

Here is a breakdown of the historic outcomes and the new "Visa-Free" facility:

The Visa-Free Transit Breakthrough

The most immediate benefit for Indian citizens is the abolition of the **Airport Transit Visa (Type A)** requirement.

Justice Manoj Kumar Gupta Appointed Chief Justice of Uttarakhand High Court



In a significant move for the Himalayan state's judiciary, **Justice Manoj Kumar Gupta** was officially sworn in as the **15th Chief Justice of the Uttarakhand High Court** on **January 10, 2026**.

His appointment ensures a seamless leadership transition following the retirement of the previous incumbent, **Justice Guhanathan Narendar**, on January 9, 2026.

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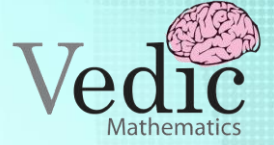

Skydo Gets RBI Approval for PA-CB Licence

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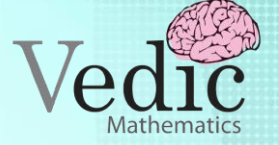

The origins of the name **Bengaluru** are a beautiful mix of hard historical evidence and charming local folklore. While the story of "boiled beans" is the most famous, archaeological findings show the name is much older than that legend suggests.

The Historical Fact: The Begur Inscription

The most authentic and earliest proof of the name comes from a **9th-century hero stone**





(Viragallu) found in the Nageshwara Temple in Begur, a suburb of Bengaluru.

- **The Evidence:** Dated approximately 890 CE, the inscription is written in **Hale Kannada** (Old Kannada).
- **The Story:** It records a "Battle of Bengaluru" (*Bengaluru Kadana*) and mentions the death of a warrior named Buttanashetty.
- **The Meaning:** Historians suggest that in Old Kannada, **Benga-val-ooru** likely meant the "City of Guards" or "Place of Bodyguards." This debunks the idea that the name was created in the 12th or 16th century, as a place called "Bengaluru" already existed over 1,100 years ago.

The Popular Legend: Benda-kaal-ooru

Despite the archaeological evidence, the "Town of Boiled Beans" story remains the most beloved piece of folklore among locals.

- **The Tale:** In the 12th century, King Veera Ballala II of the Hoysala Empire was hunting in a forest and lost his way.
- **The Encounter:** Exhausted and hungry, he stumbled upon a small hut where an old woman offered him a simple meal of **boiled beans** (*Benda kaalu* in Kannada).
- **The Naming:** Grateful for the humble meal that saved his life, the King named the area **Benda-kaal-ooru** (Town of Boiled Beans), which eventually evolved into Bengaluru.

Alternative Theories

- **The "Benga" Tree:** Some linguists believe the name comes from the **Benga** tree (*Pterocarpus marsupium* or Indian Kino

Tree), which was once abundant in the region.

- **White Quartz:** Another theory suggests it was called **Biliya Kallina Ooru** (City of White Stones) due to the abundance of white quartz rocks found in the old areas of the city like Balepet.

Founding of the "Modern" City

While the name "Bengaluru" existed since at least 890 CE, the **modern city** as we know it was founded in **1537 CE** by **Kempe Gowda I**, a feudal ruler under the Vijayanagara Empire. He built a mud fort and established the *Pettahs* (market areas) that still form the heart of the city today.
