Pawan Kalyan Becomes First Indian to Receive Rare Samurai Martial Arts Honour

Rajasthan's First Fully Organic Village



The transition of **Bamanwas Kankar Panchayat** in the newly formed Kotputli-Behror district is a landmark moment for Rajasthan. On **January**

2, 2026, the community took a formal pledge to eliminate chemical-based agriculture and animal husbandry entirely, making it the first fully organic-certified village body in the state and Northwest India.

Key Features of the Transformation

This shift wasn't just a government mandate; it was a grassroots movement driven by concerns over soil health and rising input costs.

- **100% Chemical-Free:** Farmers across seven hamlets (Bamanwas, Nangalhedi, Rah Ka Mala, Bhadana Ki Bhaal, Tolawas, Khariya Ki Dhani, and Bairawas) have abandoned synthetic fertilizers and pesticides.
- **Integrated Certification:** Unlike many certifications that only focus on crops, Bamanwas Kankar includes **organic-certified cattle**. Over 6,000 cattle are now managed under ecological and health-conscious standards.
- **Support System:** The **Cofarmin Federation of Organic Societies and Producer Companies (COFED)** provided the technical guidance and institutional support needed to meet the National Programme for Organic Production (NPOP) standards.
- **Women-Led Initiative:** Local women played a pivotal role in organizing the community and driving the transition toward a more sustainable lifestyle.





Impact on the Community

Category	Specific Benefits Observed

India and Germany Strengthen Ties in Postal and Logistics Services



The recent collaboration between India and Germany marks a pivotal moment in the modernization of international logistics. Signed on January 12, 2026, in Ahmedabad, these

agreements were a cornerstone of **Chancellor Friedrich Merz's** first official visit to India.

By merging the extensive "last-mile" reach of **India Post** (the world's largest postal network) with the global logistical expertise of **Deutsche Post-DHL**, the partnership aims to create a seamless bridge for trade between the two nations.

The Architecture of the Partnership

Two distinct legal instruments were exchanged to cover both policy-level cooperation and operational execution:

Instrument	Signatories	Primary Objective
Joint Declaration of Intent (JDoI)	Dept. of Posts (India) & Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs (Germany)	Formalizing a government-to-government framework for logistics and e-commerce policy.
Letter of Intent (LoI)	Dept. of Posts (India) & Deutsche Post AG / DHL	Developing joint "premium" international express products and time-definite delivery services.

Strategic Impact and Key Outcomes

The collaboration is designed to move beyond simple mail exchange into high-tech, integrated logistics:

- Time-Definite International (TDI) Services:** A new suite of premium products will be launched, offering end-to-end tracking and faster transit times for shipments leaving India for European markets.



- **Empowering MSMEs and Artisans:** By providing affordable, reliable global shipping, the partnership specifically targets small producers and startups, allowing them to bypass traditional, expensive freight hurdles.
- **Digitalization & Green Logistics:** Both nations committed to sharing best practices in **green logistics** (carbon-neutral delivery) and the digitalization of postal operations to improve efficiency and transparency.
- **Bilateral Rate Arrangements:** The entities will explore specialized pricing for letters and parcels to make cross-border trade more cost-effective for individual consumers and businesses alike.

The Broader Context

This agreement was part of a larger set of **19 MoUs** signed during Chancellor Merz's visit, which also included a landmark **Defense Industrial Cooperation Roadmap** and a **Semiconductor Ecosystem Partnership**. It highlights Germany's role as India's top trading partner in the EU, with bilateral trade having recently surpassed **\$50 billion**.

Nissan Strengthens India Leadership, Appoints Thierry Sabbagh as President

Sabbagh's appointment is a key component of the **Re:Nissan** transformation plan—a rigorous global recovery strategy aimed at returning the company to profitability by FY2026.

National Sports Governance Rules 2026 Notified to Reform Sports Administration



The notification of the **National Sports Governance (National Sports Bodies) Rules, 2026**, on January 12, 2026, marks a transformative era for Indian sports. Stemming from the **National Sports Governance Act, 2025**, these rules move beyond advisory guidelines to provide a legally enforceable framework that aligns India with the Olympic Charter and international standards.

Here is a breakdown of the key reforms introduced:

1. Athlete-Centric Governance

The rules ensure that those who have played the game have a direct say in how it is run:

- **Mandatory Inclusion:** Every National Sports Body (NSB) must include at least **four Sportspersons of Outstanding Merit (SOMs)** as voting members in their General Body.
- **Tiered Eligibility:** A **10-tier classification** system has been established to identify SOMs, ranging from Olympic/Paralympic medalists (Tier 1) to National Championship medalists (Tier 10).
- **Retirement Norms:** To qualify as an SOM, an athlete must be at least **25 years old**, retired from active play, and have a "cooling-off" period of at least one year from competitive selection events.

2. Landmark Gender Representation

In a major push for inclusivity, the rules institutionalize female leadership:

- **General Body Parity:** Of the mandatory SOMs in the General Body, **50% must be women**.
- **Executive Committee:** There must be at least **four women** in the Executive Committee (EC). NSBs are encouraged to reserve specific posts (like Vice President or Joint Secretary) for women in their bye-laws to ensure this is met.

3. Integrity and Accountability

To professionalize administration and curb "politicization," several strict measures have been enacted:

- **Disqualification Criteria:** Individuals convicted by a court and sentenced to imprisonment are barred from contesting elections or holding any committee positions.

- **Term & Age Limits:** Executive Committee terms are capped at **four years**, with specific age limits (generally 25 to 70 years) to ensure a regular renewal of leadership.
- **Independent Oversight:** A **National Sports Election Panel** (consisting of at least 20 members) will oversee elections to ensure they are fair, transparent, and follow a standardized timeline.

Implementation Timeline

The government has set clear deadlines to ensure these reforms don't remain on paper:

Milestone	Timeline
Bye-law Amendments	NSBs must align their internal rules with the new Act within 6 months .
Roster Preparation	Athlete rosters must be prepared 90 days before EC term expiry.
Electoral Officer	Appointment must happen 60 days before the term ends.
Appeals	A National Sports Tribunal has been established for specialized, faster adjudication of disputes.

Why This Matters

For decades, Indian sports bodies often faced criticism for lack of transparency and the concentration of power among non-athletes. By giving statutory force to these rules, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, led by **Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya**, aims to create a "pollution-free" governance environment that prioritizes athlete welfare and high-performance results.



Tripura Gramin Bank Launches India's First Solar-Powered ATM Van

The launch of 'TGB on Wheels' by Tripura Gramin Bank (TGB) in January 2026 is a landmark moment for financial inclusion in Northeast India. The **Charminar** is truly the beating heart of Hyderabad's history and culture. Beyond its stunning architecture, it represents a pivotal moment in the city's urban planning and spiritual life.

Here are a few deeper insights into this iconic "Four Towers" structure:

Architectural Brilliance

The Charminar is a perfect example of the **Indo-Islamic** architectural style, specifically the **Qutb Shahi** school of design.

- **The Structure:** It is a square structure, with each side measuring 20 meters. The four grand arches face the four cardinal points (North, South, East, and West).
- **The Minarets:** Each of the four minarets stands approximately **56 meters** high. They are four-storied, and unlike many other monuments, the minarets are actually built into the main structure, providing both aesthetic beauty and structural support.
- **The Upper Floor:** While many see it only from the ground, the upper floor of the Charminar houses a **mosque**—the oldest in the city—and 45 prayer spaces.

The Legend of the Plague

As you mentioned, it was built by **Sultan Muhammad Quli Qutb Shah** in 1591. Historical records suggest that the Sultan prayed for the end of a devastating plague that was ravaging his new city. Laad Bazaar	Famous for its traditional "bangles," this market has operated in the shadow of the Charminar for centuries.
The Unfinished Arch	To the north lies the <i>Char Kaman</i> (Four Arches), which served as the gateway to the royal palaces.

Did You Know?

- **A Secret Tunnel?** Local folklore suggests there is a secret underground tunnel connecting the Charminar to **Golconda Fort**, designed as an escape route for the royal family during a siege. While many believe it exists, its exact location remains a mystery!
- **Symbol of a State:** The Charminar is so central to the identity of the region that it is featured in the official **Emblem of Telangana**.


