New Initiatives & Strategic Shifts

India & UK Launch Offshore Wind Taskforce Under Vision 2035



This launch marks a significant transition for India's renewable energy landscape, shifting focus from land-based solar and wind to the vast, untapped potential of its 7,600 km coastline.

The India-UK Offshore Wind Taskforce, or "Trustforce," is designed to bridge the gap between India's massive market scale and the UK's mature technical expertise (the UK is

currently the world's second-largest offshore wind market).

The Three Strategic Pillars

The taskforce will operate through three execution-focused workstreams to ensure the project moves beyond "symbolic" cooperation:

- 1. Ecosystem & Market Design:** Developing refined seabed leasing frameworks and "revenue certainty" mechanisms to ensure projects are bankable for international investors.
- 2. Infrastructure & Supply Chain:** Modernizing Indian ports to handle massive turbines and fostering local manufacturing of specialized components like subsea cables and foundations.
- 3. Finance & Risk Mitigation:** Implementing **Blended Finance** models and leveraging the government's recently approved **₹7,453 crore Viability Gap Funding (VGF)** to offset the high initial costs of offshore installation.

Why Offshore Wind? The Vision 2035 Context

As of February 2026, India's non-fossil fuel capacity has crossed **272 GW**, but offshore wind is seen as the "missing piece" for grid stability.

India & France Launch Game-Changing AI Centre at AIIMS Delhi



This inauguration at AIIMS New Delhi represents a cornerstone of the **2026 India-France Year of Innovation**. Launched on **February 18, 2026**, the **Indo-French Centre for AI in Health (IF-CAIH)** isn't just a research lab; it's a strategic move to create a "Third Way" in

AI—one that prioritizes sovereignty and ethics over the data-monopolies of Silicon Valley or state-led models elsewhere.

Core Objectives of IF-CAIH

The center is built on a tripartite agreement between **AIIMS New Delhi, Sorbonne University,** and the **Paris Brain Institute,** with support from **IIT Delhi.** Its mission is categorized into three specific tracks:

Mumbai to Host Prince William's Earthshot Prize 2026 During Climate Week



Hosting the Earthshot Prize 2026 is a massive win for Mumbai and a testament to India's track record in the competition—India has produced more winners and finalists than any other country to date.

The announcement, made on February 17, 2026, by Prince William via video message, coincided with the inaugural Mumbai Climate Week, effectively turning the city into a global "Green Lab" for the month.

The "Green Oscars" in Mumbai: What to Expect

Scheduled for November 2026, the ceremony will be the first time the Earthshot Prize is held in India, following previous hosts London, Boston, Singapore, Cape Town, and Rio de Janeiro.

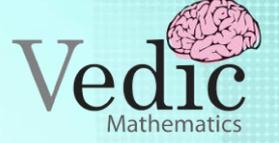

RBI's New Rulebook- UTI Required for All OTC Derivative Deals by 2027



This mandate, announced in February 2026, represents a significant structural shift in how India monitors its financial markets. While the RBI initially proposed an April 2026 rollout, they have officially pushed the implementation date to **January 1, 2027**, to give banks and financial institutions more time to overhaul their technical infrastructure.

The goal is to eliminate the "blind spots" in the OTC (Over-the-Counter) market—where trades are private and bilateral—by assigning a 52-



character "digital fingerprint" to every single contract.

How the UTI Works

The UTI isn't just a random number; it follows global **CPMI-IOSCO standards** to ensure that Indian trades can be tracked even if they involve foreign counterparties.

- **Composition:** The code starts with the 20-character **Legal Entity Identifier (LEI)** of the generating entity, followed by a unique string of up to 32 characters.
- **Lifecycle Persistence:** Once assigned, the UTI remains attached to the trade from execution to maturity, even if the contract is modified. Only "lifecycle events" that create a brand new contract (like a **novation**) trigger a new UTI.

The "Waterfall" Mechanism

To avoid confusion over who generates the code for a private trade, the RBI has established a clear hierarchy of responsibility:

Scenario	Primary Generator
Cleared Trades	The Central Counterparty (e.g., CCIL).
Platform Trades	The Electronic Trading Platform (ETP).
Direct Private Trades	The Clearing Member or an entity agreed upon by both parties.
Fallback	If no entity is designated, the CCIL Trade Repository will generate it.

Key Operational Changes

- **Reporting Window:** Market participants now have **5 business days** from the trade date to report the final UTI (increased from the 2 days initially proposed).
- **Temporary UTIs:** If a final ID isn't ready at the time of reporting, entities can submit an "Interim UTI" to avoid compliance delays.
- **Scope:** The rule covers Rupee interest rate swaps, FX forwards/swaps, G-Sec forwards, and credit derivatives.

Why this matters for the Economy

OTC derivatives often involve massive sums of money but lack the transparency of stock exchanges. By mandating UTIs, the RBI can:

1. **Spot Systemic Risk:** See if a single bank has "hidden" exposures across multiple private deals.
2. **Prevent Double-Counting:** Ensure the same trade isn't reported twice by different parties.
3. **Global Alignment:** Make Indian derivatives markets more attractive to international investors by matching the transparency standards of the US and EU.



Organ Donations in Tamil Nadu



This record-breaking month is a major milestone for Tamil Nadu's health infrastructure, especially for the **Non-Transplant Organ Retrieval Centres (NTORC)** program, which allows smaller hospitals to harvest organs without needing full transplant surgery facilities.

Here is a more detailed look at the statistics and the factors driving this surge.



Donation Breakdown: January 2026

Of the **33 donors** recorded in January, **19 (nearly 60%)** were from government hospitals. This is significant because it shows that the organ donation movement is moving beyond major metro private hospitals into rural and semi-urban government centers.

The "State Honour" Effect

The Transplant Authority of Tamil Nadu (TRANSTAN) attributes this rise to a specific policy move by the state government: **Government Order (GO) 331 (2023)**.

- Under this order, the mortal remains of brain-dead donors are accorded **official State Honours** (a ceremonial salute and tribute by government officials).
- Since its inception, over **639 donors** have been honored.

- This policy has shifted public perception, turning a moment of grief into a moment of extreme civic pride, which has significantly increased the "consent rate" among grieving families.

Key Performance Indicators (Feb 2026)

The momentum hasn't slowed down since January ended. According to N. Gopalakrishnan, Member Secretary of TRANSTAN:

- The "One-a-Day" Rate:** As of mid-February 2026, Tamil Nadu has recorded **42 donations in the first 43 days** of the year.
- Geographic Spread:** More than half of the recent donations are coming from hospitals situated outside of Chennai, proving the success of the decentralized NTOHC model.
- National Standing:** Tamil Nadu continues to lead India in deceased organ donations, having recorded **267 donors in 2025**, surpassing Telangana (205) and Karnataka (198).

Strategic Outlook: Reducing "Time Poverty"

While donations are up, the challenge for 2026 remains the "utility rate" of organs like hearts and lungs, which have a very short shelf life. The state is currently working on:

- Drone Logistics:** Trials for using drones to transport smaller organs across city traffic.
- Green Corridors:** Strengthening the coordination between the police and health departments to create traffic-free routes for organ transport.

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
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FACTS ABOUT BHARAT

This tribute captures the essence of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj—a visionary whose strategies continue to influence modern India.

His birth anniversary, celebrated as **Shivaji Jayanti** on **February 19**, is not just a regional festival in Maharashtra but a national acknowledgment of his role as the "Architect of Indian Independence" through the Maratha Empire.

The Father of the Indian Navy

Shivaji Maharaj was one of the few rulers of his era who realized that "He who rules the sea, rules the land."

- **The Strategic Vision:** To counter the growing influence of the Portuguese, British, and Dutch, he built a dedicated naval fleet consisting of diverse ships like *Gurabs* and *Galivats*.
- **Sea Forts:** He constructed legendary sea forts like **Sindhudurg** and **Vijaydurg**, which served as defensive bastions and naval bases.
- **Modern Connection:** In September 2022, the Indian Navy officially moved away from its colonial past by unveiling a **new Naval Ensign**. The new flag features a blue octagonal seal inspired by Shivaji Maharaj's **Rajmudra** (royal seal), cementing his legacy as the father of the force.

Military Brilliance: "Ganimi Kava"

He didn't just fight; he outmaneuvered. His use of **Guerrilla Warfare** (called *Ganimi Kava*) was revolutionary for the Deccan landscape:

- **The Terrain Advantage:** He used the rugged Sahyadri mountains as a natural fortress, allowing his smaller units to ambush much larger Mughal and Bijapur armies.
- **Fort Capture:** He captured his first fort, **Torna**, at just 16 years old. By the time of his coronation in 1674, he controlled over **300 forts**, creating a chain of defense that was nearly impenetrable.

A Secular and Just Ruler

While he fought for "Hindavi Swarajya," his administration was famously inclusive:

- **Diverse Army:** His personal bodyguards and several high-ranking generals were Muslims. For instance, **Siddi Ibrahim** was a key naval commander, and **Madari Mehtar** played a vital role in his famous escape from Agra.
- **Code of Conduct:** He strictly prohibited the harm of holy books (like the Quran) or places of worship during his raids. He also enforced a legendary policy of respecting women, even those belonging to his enemies.

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
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
