

In SBI Clerical Cadre (Phase-I) Examination 3-6 questions based on Misspelt and Inappropriate Words may be asked. Questions based on Misspelt and Inappropriate Words are usually asked in three different ways. In the first type of questions, the candidate is required to choose the correctly spelt word out of the given words and in the second type of questions, the candidate is required to choose the misspelt word. In the third type of questions, a sentence is given with four words printed in bold type. One of these four words may be either wrongly spelt or inappropriate in the context of the sentence. The candidate is required to find out that word. If all the words printed in bold are correctly spelt and also appropriate in the context of the sentence, the candidate should choose the fifth option 'All correct'.

The purpose of such questions is to test a candidate's knowledge of correct spellings and his ability to write correct English.

Rapid Clues

- Learn various spelling rules.
- Pay special attention to the words which are exceptions to different rules.
- Look for the words which are often misspelt.
- Try to pronounce the words correctly. Correct pronunciation helps in writing correct spellings.
- Enhance and expand your vocabulary by reading magazines, newspapers, books etc.
- Know the appropriate usage of words and use them in your daily work.

Important Spelling Rules

Final Consonant

Rule 1 One-syllable words ending in single vowel + single consonant double the consonant before a suffix beginning with a vowel. e.g.,

(i) beg + ed = begged

(ii) big + er = bigger

(iii) swim + ing = swimming

(iv) sad + est = saddest

Rule 2 Words of two or three syllables ending in single vowel + single consonant double the final consonant if the last syllable is stressed. e.g.,

(i) permit + ed = permitted

(ii) occur + ing = occurring

(iii) control + er = controller

(iv) begin + ing = beginning

Rule 3 Consonant 'l' is doubled in the words ending in single vowel +

'l' before a suffix beginning with a vowel, e.g.,

(i) signal + ing = signalling

(ii) repel + ent = repellent

(iii) quarrel + ed = quarrelled

(iv) travel + er = traveller

Rule 4 When the suffix 'full' is added to a word, one 'l' is removed. e.g.,

(i) faith + full = faithful

(ii) use + full = useful

If the word to which the suffix 'full' is added ends in 'll', one 'l' is removed from the word also. e.g.,

(i) skill + full = skilful

(ii) will + full = wilful

Final 'e'

Rule 5 Words ending in silent 'e', drop the 'e' before a suffix beginning with a vowel. e.g.,

(i) hope + ing = hoping

(ii) live + ed = lived

(ii) drive + er = driver

(iv) tire + ing = tiring

If the suffix begins with a consonant, 'e' is not dropped. e.g.,

(i) hope + full = hopeful

(ii) sincere + ly = sincerely



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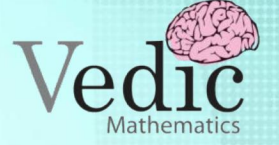
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But,

- (i) true + ly = truly
- (ii) nine + th = ninth
- (iii) argue + ment = argument

Rule 6 When the suffix 'ous' is added to a word ending in 'ce', 'e' is changed to 'i'. e.g.,

- (i) space + ous = spacious
- (ii) vice + ous = vicious
- (iii) malice + ous = malicious
- (iv) grace + ous = gracious

Rule 7 Words ending in 'ee', do not drop an 'e' before a suffix. e.g.,

- (i) see + ing = seeing
- (ii) agree + ment = agreement
- (iii) foresee + ing = foreseeing
- (iv) agree + able = agreeable

Rule 8 When the suffix 'ing' is added to a word ending in 'ie', 'ie' is changed to 'y'. e.g.,

- (i) lie + ing = lying
- (ii) die + ing = dying
- (i) tie + ing = tying

Final 'y'

Rule 9 A final 'y' following a consonant changes to 'i' before a suffix except ing. e.g.,

- (i) carry + ed = carried
- (ii) happy + ly = happily
- (iii) marry + age = marriage
- (iv) beauty + full = beautiful

But,

- (i) marry + ing = marrying
- (ii) carry + ing = carrying

Rule 10 A final 'y' following a vowel does not change before a suffix.

e.g.,

- (i) obey + ed = obeyed
- (ii) play + er = player

(iii) pray + ed = prayed

'ie' or 'ei'

Rule 11 In a word, 'ei' is generally used after 'c' and 'ie' is used after any other letter. e.g.,
