#### The Passage

By April 2026, the global discourse on Artificial Intelligence has shifted from "Generative" to "Agentic." Unlike its predecessors, which primarily synthesized information, Agentic AI systems are characterized by their ability to operate autonomously—setting their own sub-goals, using digital tools, and correcting their own errors without constant human oversight. While this shift has catalyzed a 4% surge in global GDP productivity, it has simultaneously exacerbated the "digital cleavage" between nations. In the Nairobi Summit of 2026, leaders argued that while developed economies are using these autonomous agents to solve complex logistical bottlenecks, developing nations face a "technological paradox." They possess the data to

train these systems but lack the localized compute infrastructure to deploy them. Furthermore, the labor market is witnessing a "Bifurcation of Skills." The demand for mid-tier cognitive roles is plummeting, while the need for "AI Orchestrators"—individuals who can manage fleets of autonomous agents—has reached an all-time high.
